Winch Brothers Build Future Breeding Milking Shorthorns

FENNIMORE, Wis. — Brothers Randy and Matthew Winch of Fennimore, Wis., have found a mutual calling, working together to breed and develop a herd of registered Milking Shorthorns.

Randy, 18, and Matthew, 14, reside on Pine Grove Farm with their parents, Peter and Christina, and their brother Wesley, 15. Their family milks a mixed-breed herd, with robotic milkers. Randy's herd of Milking Shorthorn currently numbers 18 head, the majority of which are home-bred and carry the family's W-Pine Grove prefix. Matthew has amassed nine head. The boys own a couple of those animals together in partnership.

The journey began in earnest when Randy, a fourth-grader at the time, won \$1,000 in a contest sponsored by the All-Weather Livestock Marker brand. He had an interest in the Milking Shorthorn breed that came from the couple of Milking Shorthorn's in the family's milking herd. Randy decided to invest his prize money in a Milking Shorthorn of his own. He purchased a spring calf named Rea from Lazy M Farm in nearby Stitzer, Wis.

"I showed Rea that summer," Randy said, explaining how his passion for the breed was cemented. "I had two heifer calves from her, Roxie and Rosie. Roxie was the first calf I showed at the Wisconsin Junior State Fair and Rosie is one of our high-

est producing cows right now."

Watching his older brother develop a love for Milking Shorthorns piqued Matthew's interest in the breed.

"I liked the coloring of the breed," Matthew said. "We had a Milking Shorthorn born on our farm, and I decided to purchase that calf from my father."

As the brothers have earned and saved up money, they each have continued investing in the Milking Shorthorn breed, participating in the Share-A-Heifer program and making purchases at the Wisconsin State Milking Shorthorn Sale.

Mapleton Vly Spark Ember was Ran-

dy's Share-A-Heifer calf, and he was able to purchase her back from the program at the State Sale, after she placed fifth at the World Dairy Expo for him in the winter yearling class.

Since purchasing her outright from the program, Ember has added two daughters to the growing herd. Randy learned a lesson in perseverance and determination raising Ember's first calf, which was born with a cleft palate.

"I fed her a half bottle four or five times a day, because that was all she could drink before she got tired," Randy said. "She is doing great now and is due to calve this spring."

Ember calved again last fall, with another heifer calf that Randy is excited to show this coming summer.

Another highlight of their young careers as Milking Shorthorn breeders was when their homebred spring yearling, W-Pine Grove Anecdote Athena, received honorable mention honors in the 2019 Junior All-American contest.

As their herd continues to grow and expand, the boys have plans to classify their herd in March. They hope to continue to grow and develop the pedigrees of the animals in their herd with the addition of classification scores.

"We have a couple of cows right now that we are really happy with," Randy said. "I want to get them classified in case I want to sell animals in the future."

Setting goals they can work towards is

something that is important to both boys.

"One of my goals used to be to show at World Dairy Expo," Randy said. "I reached that goal. My next goal I want to reach is to be able to place in the top three in a class with a bred and owned animal. Long-term, I would like to have my own hobby farm where I can raise some show heifers."

Matthew's goals are similar.

"I would like to have my own herd of about 20 or so cows with some really good genetics someday," Matthew said. "That will help me be able to compete at shows like Expo."

To help them reach their goals, the boys spend time working together, researching pedigrees and studying available bulls to make the best mating decisions they can to propel their herd forward.

"We are working on breeding for type,

size and production, trying to breed those in the best we can; but we focus mainly on production," Randy said.

Service sires the pair are currently using include Patriot, Lottery, Camaro and Gianni.

"The best calf we have on the ground right now is a Lucky Strikes daughter," Randy said.

As they have been working together to develop their herds, Randy has had the leadership role for the past few years. The balance will shift this year, though, as Randy prepares to attend South Dakota State University to study agricultural engineering.

"I will be relying on Matthew to take care of the show heifers," Randy said. "But I am pretty sure it's a challenge he will be up to."

Small is the New Big at

Oake Knoll Farm

in Massachusetts

When Terri Lawton and Nevin Wenger purchased Oake Knoll Farm at the Lawton Family Farm in Foxboro, Massachusetts, they became the eleventh generation to own and operate the family farm.

That's right. Eleven generations---same land. They possess the original land grant from King George II of England who signed the deed in 1732 as proof. It's the year George Washington was born, and Benjamin Franklin began writing Poor Richard's Almanac.

Twenty-five acres remain from the original land grant in Foxboro, midway between Providence, Rhode Island and Boston, Massachusetts, and two major interstate highways. Executives and professional athletes call the bedroom community home. Gillette Stadium, home of the New England Patriots, stands on land once owned by the Lawton family.

The farm's history is not the only intriguing story at Oake Knoll Farm. The owners have figured out how to evolve, adapt, and remain viable with each generation as urban America chiseled away pieces of the farm over nearly three centuries.

Registered Ayrshire cattle graze the farm's fields where Holsteins once called home. Terri introduced the breed as a youth. "I liked them and eventually discovered they would bring value back to the farm," she said.

In Massachusetts, it is legal to sell raw bottled milk at the farm and Oake Knoll used the opportunity by becoming a fully licensed raw milk bottler. Raw milk must be as clean or cleaner than pasteurized milk in terms of bacterial count with less than 20,000 cells per ml, coliform less than 10 cfu/ml and SCC meeting or exceeding federal standards. On the last test, Oake Knoll average SCC was less than 20,000 c/ml. The last co-op pick-up was a decade ago.

"Ayrshire milk gives me a competitive edge; it is a sweeter milk," Terri said. "Even



though the fat content is the same, sometimes Jersey milk is just too thick, and our customers will drive a long distance just to get our Ayrshire milk."

As a student at Purdue University in ag communications and animal agribusiness, Terri worked on studies and case scenarios that would bring value back to the farm in terms of making business opportunities with a strong return on investment. She knew the farm was always her calling but worked as a state dairy inspector for several years before her parents retired nearly two years ago.

"Ayrshires are a phenomenal cow for cheesemaking with 2% higher yield than Holsteins on cheese," she said. "It's because of the molecular structure of the fat which is a smaller molecule in Ayrshires over the other breeds. Ayrshire milk is highly sought after in areas where artisan cheese is popular."

Her ideal cow is 90+ points, polled, A2, over 4% milkfat and BB kappa casein gene carrier. "It's exciting because I have several cows in the barn that fit all the requirements right now, and most cows in the barn are 90+," Terri said. She looks for

bulls that fit her profile and uses some of her own genetics with bulls from Triple-Hil Sires in Maryland along with Hi-Ayr-View Magnum and S&M-Ayr Major's Milkman, two current favorites. "I can be very intense with culling because of the way the beef market is now. I can get \$10 a pound for ground beef. If an animal looks at me funny, it is highly likely to get on the truck."

Her genetic choices are popular for more than flavor and versatility. Terri has consigned a winter calf out of Oake Knoll Predator Now to the Massachusetts Blue Ribbon Calf Sale in April. As a former Ayrshire Outstanding Youth Award winner, and 4H and collegiate dairy judging participant, she supports youth activities within the dairy industry any way she can.

Terri and Nevin are taking the market into a new era by adding more dairy products like yogurt, cheese, beef, and eggs. In addition to the owners, five employees work on the farm and there are three vacant positions. Terri is the cheese maker and is looking for another employee to train. Heat and serve meals featuring the farm's products will soon be added to the product list.

To say that a lot has happened since Terri and Nevin acquired the farm is an understatement. Three days after signing ownership papers, Terri gave birth to their fifth son, expanding the family to four children under four years old plus a sixteen-year-old at the time.

COVID was the next big challenge, but a blessing in disguise for the farm market. "Grocery stores ran out of meat, bread, milk, everything perishable," Terri said. "It put us in an interesting position. We were able to provide the community with products that weren't available anywhere. That gave us an opportunity to grow in a way that we probably wouldn't have because more people were stopping in here. They were looking for food they could cook quickly; we sold lots of hamburger, steaks, sausages, along with our milk and cheese."

Saturdays are the market's biggest days. More than 300 customers visited the market on the top selling Saturday in February.

Terri would love to replace the flat-barn milking set up with a bedded pack and robot milker. "My husband and I want to create a farm that all of our boys would like to come and work at. A lot of that involves setting things up so that it is fun, exciting,



and interesting. We want to create the ability to start projects, bring ideas that will generate income and financial sustainability to the farm for theirs and the next generation.

It takes a lot of work to keep the farm in the family."

Audrey Gay Rodgers is a third generation Ayrshire breeder in Belleville, PA. With gratitude to her father, John Reed Rodgers, the herd prefix Plum Bottom continues in the 21st century. Cow families are a priority in their grass-based management system. The herd grazes 110 acres of grass-mixed pastures, rotationally, from April through December. Surplus grass is made into dry hay and wrapped hay for winter feeding and milk production. These girls, 'raised 2 Graze' as calves and heifers, are on grass too as much as the seasonal weather conditions allow.

Plum Bottom Ayrshires reside at Gay's Hameau Farm in the Big Valley, where value-added enterprises give these beautiful bovines additional exposure to non-farm populations. Two years ago, the farm was licensed to sell raw milk by the PA Department of Agriculture. Conversations with each new customer introduces the grazing concept and the red and white four-legged grazing machines gracing the green pastures. And why is that image so right and memorable? Artists who have been attending plein air painting workshops at the farm for the past 20 years have explained to Gay the importance of the color wheel—red and green are complimentary colors as they are viewed daily during these retreats.

Twenty-five years ago, the barn doors at the farm



opened a bit wider. 'Farm Camp' for girls, ages 8-14, allows rural and urban to meet. For six weeks each summer girls attend a summer program of chores, farm activities, field trips and culminates each session with a Farm Show. Most of the girls attending are from major metropolitan areas and return home dirty, tired and understanding the daily routine of a working dairy farm. Ayrshire rolls comfortably off their tongues! After two weeks, they have an emotional connection with the cows! Most return year after year and some have gone on to Colleges of Agriculture at Penn State, Cornell, Michigan State University and West Virginia University. Two are currently studying veterinary medicine at Penn and UC Davis. Six girls now own calves, heifers and cows in the Plum Bottom herd.

Gay's involvement with the Ayrshire Breeders' Association has been long term and multifaceted. The herd is enrolled in the REWARDS program. The Plum Bottom girls have been well-received as consignments in National Convention Sales. She remembers participating in numerous events as a young girl hosted by her parents and then in 2015 welcoming the National Convention to Hameau Farm for a Plum Bottom herd tour and dinner. The last three Presidents of the Association have placed her on the national Promotion Committee. Agreeing that to a large degree the ability to get the word out about our cow is individual promotion, some projects the committee has worked on are the Association display designs for World Dairy Expo, updated pamphlets on the versatility of the Ayrshire cow, searched out new and creative marketing potentials and encouraged new Ayrshire owners and members to participate in Ayrshire shows and events at the national, state and local levels.

Rodgers' involvement in the PA Ayrshire Breeders' Association has been at the board level and on various committees. A history of PA Ayrshire Breeders was edited for the National Convention in 2015. For a few years, the state spring sale was held at Plum Bottom then with the addition of a Spring Heifer Show, the event was moved to Shippensburg and has grown tremendously at that venue. Yearly Plum Bottom animals have been consigned to the state sale and show strings have exhibited at the Spring Heifer Sale, Huntingdon County Fair, Mifflin County Youth Fair, Clinton County Fair and Juniata County Fair.

Hameau, when loosely translated, means community. And community is important to Audrey Gay Rodgers. She is currently serving on the PASA Sustainable Agriculture board of directors, is on the board of the Kishacoquillas Valley Historical Society, a founding Steering Committee member of the Pennsylvania Women's Agricultural Network, a member of Belleville Reading Club and attends the East Kishacoquillas Presbyterian Church. Gay feels that relationships are the spice of life and she counts herself very fortunate to have strong family (cows and humans!) and friendship bonds.

Steven "Barney"

Schmidt and his family live near Delavan, Wisconsin. Steve has worked with Ayrshires his entire life. His first experience was as a young boy at his Uncle Harold and Aunt Alice Ehrman's South Slope Farm. As an adult, he and his wife, Pauline, worked alongside her parents on Moy-Ayr Farm. Since the dispersal of Moy-Ayr Farm in 2001, they have continued with the Moy-Ayr prefix. Steve and Pauline have been married for 19 years and have two daughters, Rebecca, age 17, and Emily, age 14, who are also active on the farm. They currently have 30 Ayrshires and produce their own hay and bedding. In addition to working on the farm, Steve has been employed by The Coburn Company full-time for 19 years and Pauline has been employed at Culvers for eight years. Steve is also active with his daughters' 4-H activities and is a member of Farm Bureau and the Dairy Committee for the Walworth County Fair.

Schmidt has been a member of the Ayrshire Breeders' Association for numerous years. For the last three years he has served as ABA Director At Large, attending both June and Winter ABA Board Meetings. Steve has been a member of the



Classification Committee and Marketing Committee for the last six years.

Steve is active with Ayrshires on the state and local level. He has served as President and as a board member of the Wisconsin Ayrshire Breeders Association. The Schmidt family has exhibited at the Wisconsin State Fair for numerous years, the Wisconsin State Show since it began, the Iowa State Fair several times, and the Walworth County Fair since the girls were in Little Britches. In addition to the state and regional shows, the Schmidt family has also exhibited numerous years at World Dairy Expo and several times at the Southern National in Louisville, KY. Steve and Pauline have encouraged their daughters to become involved with Ayrshires since they began showing in "Little Britches" at the county fair. They have supported the Ayrshire breed by consigning animals to the Wisconsin Spring Ayrshire Sale for several years and to the National Convention Sale, Iowa Spring Sale, and World Dairy Expo on numerous occasions. Steve has served as a ringman and helped with other aspects of the Wisconsin Spring Sale for several years. He also co-managed the 2012 Wisconsin National Convention Sale.

What should be the primary short-term goal (achieved with the next 12-18 months) of the Ayrshire Breeder's Association? How should this goal be achieved?

ALLEN: The short-term goals for the ABA should be to be more financially stable and increase genomic testing along with production. To achieve these goals, we have to promote our cow, "The Ayrshire". We are on a high with the Reserve Supreme cow at Expo 2019 that is a high production cow from a family that has proven it is a transmitting family by its bulls in A.I. Grand Champion before that was "Ruth", who is former #1 CPI cow of the breed.

BRUFFEY: I think the goal should be to attract more youth to the Ayrshire breed because if we have the young people involved/active, this usually includes the whole family. Possibly promoting more activities that are centered around young people because they are the future.

GILLETTE: It has been a very tough year for all; however getting the association on a sound financial base for the future should and must be job one. Without getting our association financially stable all else becomes invalid. This is possible by applying for the paycheck protection program along with several other loans and grants. We are also reviewing our programs in order to balance our membership benefits versus association income.

HANSON: For me the primary short-term goal of the ABA should be to push for more Ayrshires to be genomic tested, both male and female. If we can get more animals tested, it will increase the reliability on all genomic results within the Ayrshire breed. With more accurate results we can hopefully speed up the genetic progress of the breed as a whole. Furthermore, this gives us the ability to open up a whole new market for U.S. Ayrshires. We have all seen the market and prices of high genomic tested Holsteins, Jerseys and to a lesser extent, Brown Swiss, skyrocket over the past decade and it's a market that would be nice to have available for Ayrshire breeders. In addition to this, I would hope to get more genomic tests done on bulls within the breed. With more males tested it would give both A.I. companies and breeders more bulls to choose from when selecting sires for their stud or breeding program. This could dramatically increase the genetic progress of the Ayrshire breed. Not to mention, it would potentially open the market for more bulls to be taken in by A.I. companies in total, simply because there will be more available.

MACHIN: We need to find a way to come up with new blood. What we have now is good, but it cannot go on forever. As breeders we need to have a say in what bulls go into A.I. units.

We need to know about and find new blood.

MACKINSON: To me, the most important short-term goal of the Ayrshire breed is to remain prominent, competitive and continue to adapt. We need to continue to develop not only our cows, but we need to acquire bulls from these prominent cow families. Therefore, I feel we need to widen our selection of cow families that bulls are chosen from. Attractive cows that make you excited to get up in the morning. The cows that put milk and components in the bulk tank. The type of calves and cows that can adapt to your specific management system and tolerate weather swings.

We need to continue to market our best Ayrshire genetics and animals not only to current Ayrshire breeders but talk to breeders from other breeds. Talk and sell them on the benefits of the modern Ayrshire. This includes following up with them and listening to what they have to say. Several years ago, I had the opportunity to purchase embryos out of 9th-generation Excellent and All-American winner. One of those embryos matured into a 10th-generation Excellent with her daughter becoming the breed's first 11th-generation Excellent for us! Collaboration over competition so our breed can succeed.

I feel the online/digital way is here to stay. What if the Association hosted an online Q&A or video chat where folks can submit questions and fellow Ayrshire enthusiasts answers them? Topics could focus on breeding for components, to how Ayrshires adapt to grazing or robot technology, to finding and caring for your next All-American.

I strongly feel that we are holding our Association back by putting a 94-point maximum score on an Ayrshire. Why are we holding the great cows of today; like "Karmina", "Ray", "Stinger" and "Wishful Thinking" back? We cannot forget the elite cows of yesterday like "Ruth" and "Francesca". If a cow deserves that 95 or higher score, why are we taking that marketing tool away her breeder and/or owner? These elite cows deserve all the recognition and promotion because they are utterly amazing representative of an Ayrshire.

Rodgers - A short-term priority for the Ayrshire breed is the procurement of purebred bulls, collection and distribution of semen. One way to achieve it and this may be going out on a limb, but less emphasis and faith in genomics and more farmer-to-farmer contact. Herds and owners should be visited by more than the classifier. A breed representative, of sorts, who has their finger on the pulse of those individual cows that are breed standouts: Ayrshire dairy character, day in and day out; longevity, 100,000 lb. cows, and consistent high components. For example: Three years ago, my parents and I toured Scotland. We had contacted the Ayrshire Cattle Society prior to the trip with the request to see Ayrshires in their home environment. Duncan Hunter, many of you know him, was our guide. Days and herds later we had driven the back roads, visited herds, commercial and organic, saw phenomenal cows and met people that will be remembered for the rest of my life! We must get our good news out in similar fashion here in the United States.

Schmidt - Find herds that are not registering or are not registering all of their animals and get them caught up. One way to accomplish this could be when sale selection personnel are going to farms looking for consignments. While they are there, discuss the merits of registered animals, how to catch them up and help them to contact the office to get caught up. Another way would be to have breeders notify directors or the office of any herds that are not registering. Then the directors or the office can reach out to those individuals and assist them in their registration process.

ULLMER: ABA's goal should be about sustainability. Most sectors of life have been affected greatly by the coronavirus, and dairy is no exception. We need to become more efficient with the day-to-day operations while servicing breeders. We need to explore multi-breed partnerships to get services done and share employees. We also have to look at more revenue-based

ideas to increase income. We could add more new services to our website to generate income. We have made significant income for the ABA with our online sales. We should do more of those things moving forward.

WINKLER: Short term — long term — we as an association need to focus on a few things.

1) We need to balance the budget and make sure that our association is successful and using our assets to the best of our ability. Just like one runs their farm/business... spend money wisely where it is needed to strengthen our association, promote the Ayrshire breed and support our members. At our last board meeting great ideas for promoting our breed and getting the most "bang" for our bucks were talked about. We need to make sure that the association is financially survivable. Cost saving measures and stream-lining are a few ways that we can cut office expenses. A huge benefit to the office and the members will be the new upgraded computer system that will benefit everyone.

2) The biggest complaint I hear from people is that there isn't enough of a variety of bulls from the bull studs. We as an association need to continue to promote and encourage our members to enter the data on their animals. Now, I'm into team work... so the members need to do their part, take the time to enter the data and let your AI representative know what you are looking for in your breeding program. From there the Board can reach out to the AI companies and their techs and let them know that we want the Ayrshire breed to be promoted and excel through their bull selections! The Ayrshire breeders should have the same exposure and benefits as other breeds.

3) I have been on the board for five years now and I truly enjoy the meetings because progress is made, great ideas are shared and someone always shares an experience that we can learn from. I'm not against reaching out to the breeders in my area to find out what they like or don't like about our association, and what ideas they have that I could take to the board and share. I am a firm believer that we are all better as a group, rather than standing alone. Reaching out to our members more is a way for us to stay connected and ahead of any issues that may arise.

WOODIS: A short-term goal should be keeping breeders involved and engaged in Ayrshires by keeping registrations and transfers up-to-date. Encourage breeders to take advantage of programs offered by the ABA such as the REWARDS program, classification, and genomic testing. Events like "Ayrshire Tuesday" can get more people interested and involved. These are still tough times but anything we can do to maintain interest should help when better times are here. Hopefully, this year there will be more events, shows and meetings that we can attend and promote Ayrshires. The youth should be encouraged and helped to get into the Ayrshire breed. A lot of families have just a few animals and don't have a farm but need a place to keep their animals, so talking to bigger farmers could be helpful. The more events, shows, and meetings that we attend, will help us to get a feel of what is on the minds of breeders, potential buyers, and youths.

How can we attract more new buyers (both commercial & purebred) to the Ayrshire breed & involve them in breed association activities, programs & services?

ALLEN: The Ayrshire is in strong demand in the East. I receive calls all the time wanting to know if we have animals for sale. We need to help these people find what they are looking for by giving them contact information for others who might have animals for sale. After you sell an animal, follow up with the new owners and promote the breed and activities. Stress that people are looking to diversify and what better opportunity than the "Ayrshire Cow".

BRUFFEY: I think we can promote new buyers through social

media or possibly have a simple booth at trade shows and distribute literature about the Ayrshire breed.

GILLETTE: All members should take an interest in being a salesperson for the Ayrshire Breeders' Association. We should be advertising the many great traits of the Ayrshire breed to all dairy producers large and small.

HANSON: Attracting new buyers to our breed has always been a topic of discussion, specifically when it comes to commercial buyers. We have seen an increase in new buyers over the past few years when it comes to high type, purebred cattle, but we haven't seen the same results when it comes to commercial dairymen.

As far as the purebred side of things goes, we need to keep the new buyers that we have, while also continuously attracting additional new buyers to our breed. I think the best way to do this is to continue having high quality Ayrshires represented in all aspects of the registered side of the dairy industry. We need to make sure there are Ayrshires available in any multi-breed sales that happen throughout the U.S. Furthermore, I think we need to continue offering both Ayrshire embryos and live cattle via online sales. Both of these things help make Ayrshires more readily available to non-Ayrshire breeders with the hopes of getting more Ayrshires into different herds.

The commercial side of things is a little more difficult. I think it starts with our breeders putting more focus on traits specific to the commercial dairy industry, when breeding Ayrshires. Traits such as Fat, Protein, DPR, Livability and Productive Life are all things that all commercial dairy producers care about, even if they don't have registered/pedigreed cattle. Then it's just a matter of showcasing some of our breed's more commercially driven registered herds to the commercial dairy industry. This would hopefully convince a few larger commercial herds to give Ayrshires a try and then letting them prove their profitability against the other breeds.

MACHIN: To get Ayrshires into commercial herds, they must milk. Bull mothers in this day and age should be making 25,000 to 35,000 pounds of milk. Large herds care about two things – milk and money. As for purebred breeders, we now have in our hands the job of keeping the blood as pure as we can. People who are new to the breed want to buy a purebred animal.

MACKINSON: We need to tell everyone our "why" - Why we love the Ayrshire breed. Then when someone is interested, we cannot be afraid to sell our best genetics with the fear that someone else will succeed with them. If you want top notch cow people to be involved with our breed, they are going to want to acquire the best. Start or continue marketing your success with the breed digitally. Share information about upcoming online sales and emphasize the online bidding even if you are not selling an animal in the sale. This allows people who may not normally be buyers, the opportunity to attend one of our sales and to see firsthand how great our breed is. Continued genomic testing and expanding our genetic options on both the top and bottom of the pedigree would involve more breeders.

RODGERS: To attract new buyers and get them involved with activities, programs and services, let's ramp up and continue with some of the recent online and social media successes! The photographs, the contests for youth and the online sales have been a tad rad and can be tweaked! Perhaps Instagram 'takeovers', (low cost...with parameters we could learn about cows and cow families, farm management styles, family members...)? Do we Snapchat? Are we on TikTok? Youth and first-time buyers especially, should be recognized. An introductory paragraph and photo in The Angle. Claim an "Ayrshire Cow Day" and flood the internet with posts!

SCHMIDT: Encourage breeders to consign their best genetics to sales. If it hurts to sell it, it will interest people from other breeds. It does not matter what breed a good animal is, she is still a good animal. Promote Ayrshires in numerous multi-breed publications and all other media platforms that are available. Continue to advocate and endorse the attributes of the Ayr-

shire through research data and testimonials. Once purchased, make sure that the new buyer feels welcome to the breed and welcome to the Ayrshire family. If there are new buyers on a public or even private sale, notify the office so a follow-up can be performed. Have a director or a subcommittee member follow-up with the buyer about the animal and discuss all the wonderful opportunities, programs, and services the U.S. ABA as to offer. This individual can be the contact person for the new buyer and can assist them with answering questions or guiding them on signing up for programs and services.

ULLMER: Attracting new buyers is really a grass roots function in my opinion. I think it really comes down to taking the time to listen to what people want and sourcing it for them. The amount of growth that I have seen in the past years is remarkable. It starts with one Ayrshire in a show string or an Ayrshire in a free-stall operation and typically grows from there. At that point, the ABA has to show the value of classifying cows and the REWARDS program. Together the ABA and breeders can grow together.

WINKLER: 1. Get the statistics out there about the Ayrshire Breed. Ask people to share their "why Ayrshires" story! Take that information and share it with anyone and everyone.

- a. Easy grazing
- b. Feed to milk ratio
- c. Milk components
- d. Digestibility
- e. Longevity
- f. Udder Attachments
- g. Rugged cattle that adapt to all management systems and weather
- h. Feet & Legs
- i. Strong – Vigor calves

2. I have seen a lot of great state associations programs/incentives and I think the national association should take part in some of these programs or get involved in one way or another.

3. The number one way to attract new buyers is to go directly to the person. Talk to them, listen to them and answer all of their questions. If you take the time and make the commitment, they will respond. We all know that people have their favorite breed but if we could encourage one to two people in every state to give the Ayrshire cow a try, the benefits would be phenomenal. In the past five years or more, we have seen a lot of high-profile breeders from other breeds purchasing Ayrshire cattle. They were attracted to the Ayrshire breed and are enjoying the success with their Ayrshires. This is just one stepping-stone to attract more breeders into our wonderful association. Stay positive, work hard, reach out and encourage your farming friends to give the Ayrshire cow a chance/opportunity to prove herself.

WOODIS: The Breeders' Choice Sale and the online Embryo/Flush Sale were very successful with a lot of interest. An online sale can draw a lot more buyers than live in-person, because no one has to travel. I feel the ABA should continue with these types of sales.

One way to attract new buyers, both commercial and purebred, could be online listing of a more commercial type animals: i.e., animals with high production, high components, good solid pedigrees, animals with good type but not necessarily show winners. The animals should be registered Ayrshires and new buyers should be encouraged to keep up on registering of any offspring. A list where people could go to if they are looking for good milk cows. A calf and heifer sale geared towards youth to encourage them to get involved with Ayrshires.

Another often heard complaint is diversity of bulls. A few breeders are merchandising semen from their own bulls. I feel we should keep an open mind on this subject. There are a lot of good cows out there that in the total picture should be good bull mothers as long as these cows are genomic tested for haplotypes, percentage Ayrshire, A2A2, etc.

A LOOK BACK

Milking Shorthorn History Highlights

Z. R. Lewis Memorial Fund

Every year the AMSS produces a financial statement. For those who like to study such things, the statements of the past 30 years will have shown a line item in "Current Assets" entitled Z. R. Lewis Memorial.

When that item first appeared in 1988, Z. R. Lewis was a name which most recognized and some had even known personally. However, for most of us today, the name means little or nothing and as our membership ages, fewer and fewer members will have known Z. R. Lewis or what he meant to the Milking Shorthorn Society.

Zachary R. Lewis was born in 1888 in Scotsville, Virginia. He lived for many years in Maryland and was an officer with the Empire Construction Company in Baltimore. He was also a member of the Board of Directors of the Maryland State Fair, president and director of the Virginia-Maryland Milking Shorthorn Association and also served on the AMSS Board of Directors (1950-1956). His wife, Anita, was from the Warfield's of Virginia, well known in Shorthorn circles in the middle to late 1800's.

Starting in the mid 1930's with foundation cattle from Flintstone and Dairylou, he established his Rock Hill at Rochelle, Virginia. At that time, the Ray Garrison Dairylou Herd was exhibiting as great a milk production average and production genetics of any herd in the United States. These bloodlines were largely kept free of other crosses by judicious line breeding. During his lifetime, the merit of his herd became widely recognized and cattle from the herd were widely distributed throughout the Midwest. At the time of his death, the herd contained more cows classified "Excellent" than any other herd in the United States. From the start, he was interested in milk production and recognized that profitable and satisfactory milk production was an absolute necessity to the operation of his herd and the future of the breed.

The practical success of his operation was reflected by the fact that it became necessary to establish a second farm by the name of Salona Farm at Monkton, Virginia in the middle 50's as a show herd, with the original Rock Hill Herd at Shelby, Virginia

remaining as a working herd.

Mr. Lewis passed away on December 14, 1958 and the Rock Hill Herd was dispersed on August 22, 1959. It was a buyers' market and the top cow sold for \$650. The herd at Salona Farm was continued by Mrs. Lewis. However, she knew that Mr. Lewis was particularly anxious that something be done after his death to make possible a greater contribution and benefit to farmers interested in dual purpose cattle. At this point, a happy coincidence occurred!

In the fall of 1959, the AMSS Board of Directors established the Dual-Purpose Cattle Research Foundation to provide a means by which breeders and other interested individuals or estates could donate to the Society as a tax deductible gift. The foundation was established exclusively for research and educational purposes to improve the quality of dual purpose cattle producing both beef and milk. When Mrs. Lewis heard about this Foundation in early 1960, she immediately expressed an interest.

Mrs. Lewis gifted 19 cows and one herd sire to the Dual-Purpose Cattle Research Foundation. The next question to be answered was where to locate this group of cattle. There were opportunities with research herds at several state universities, however the Rosemount Experiment Station at the University of Minnesota already had a Milking Shorthorn research herd which had been established in July of 1959 with 109 head from the USDA Research Station at Beltsville, Maryland. Therefore, the logical best choice was to place these Lewis animals at the Rosemount Experiment Station.

The cattle there were to be under the direction of Dr. C. L. Cole, Head of the Dairy Department. He described the new arrivals as "deep and open-ribbed cows with considerable scale and quality." The 19 cows best records averaged 10,610 pounds milk, 437 pounds fat actual. Sixteen cows were classified "Excellent" and the other three "VG". The young sire included was Salona Redcoat 4th, a full brother to Louisa's W. Blossom, the 1958 Grand Champion cow at the International and Reserve Grand Champion at the National Show in 1958.

On January 6, 1960, the Zachary R. Lewis Memorial Herd came into being under an arrangement between the Foundation and the University. In 1985, the Dual-Purpose Cattle Research Foundation as reorganized to became the AMSS Research Foundation. Whereas the original Dual-Purpose Cattle Foundation allowed expenditures to be used for research on any dual purpose breed, the new AMSS Research Foundation was restricted "to perpetuate the American Milking Shorthorn Society and its objectives" and specifically stating that none of current or future monies could be expended for operating expenses of the AMSS.

In 1988, it was determined that the cattle descended from the original Lewis donation would be converted into a restricted fund known as the Z. R. Lewis Fund which has appeared in financial statements of the AMSS since that time. Currently, the Z. R. Lewis Fund is used to develop a genomic database for the breed.

The 2020 Winter meeting of the AMSS Board of Directors was called to order by President Marcia Clark at 1:30pm on Thursday December 10. Roll Call was taken, all directors were present and a quorum to conduct business was declared. The meeting was held virtually due to COVID-19.

Articles and Bylaws Committee

Tom Landrum gave the Articles and Bylaws report. Brenda will coordinate with Julie Lewis to file the restated copies with the State of Wisconsin.

The results of the voting were as follows:

Vote #1 Articles of Incorporation Vote

This vote is for the restated Articles of Incorporation. The vote will require a 2/3 majority to pass. With a vote of 126 – 20, the vote passed with a 2/3 majority.

Vote #2 Bylaws Vote

This vote is for the Bylaws. The vote will require a majority to pass. With a vote of 126 – 20, the vote passed with a majority vote.

Motion to accept the results of the restated Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws with a vote of 126 -20. Motion passed.

Education, History & Promotion Committee

National Show and All American Committee

There are 70 entries for the Futurity to be held at the 2021 World Dairy Expo. Entries are still coming in-(postmarked 12/1) for the 2022 futurity, with about 74 already in.

The show committee in Louisville presented a number of items for the committee to discuss. The dry cow class is still part of the Junior Show and already out of the open show. The show committee would also like to drop the bull calf class.

Moved to accept the recommendations of the committee to remove the dry cow and bull classes at NAILE. Motion passed.

The committee also discussed the names of classes at the various shows, including the Yearling in Milk class, but also that the Spring calves all say Spring calf and not junior calves. Updated names will be sent to all of our National Shows.

Moved that the Senior Best Three Females be renamed Best Three Females with the requirement that at least two must have freshened. Motion passed.

A Summer Junior 2-year-old class was also discussed. Comments were made in favor of and against a Summer Junior 2-year-old class; increased marketability for June calves and decreased class sizes for the other 2 year-old classes.

Moved that if a show adds a Summer Junior 2-year-old class, those animals will qualify as a Junior 2-year-old for the All American Contest and the animal must have clarification that it was a Summer Junior 2. Motion Passed.

Katie Agnew attended the World Dairy Expo meeting. There were questions about our class list and number of placings within those classes:

1) Best Udder of Show – deemed not a lead out class.

2) Dairy Herd - Moved to cut placings to 3 paid placings and allocate funds to another class at WDE. Motion passed.

3) Produce of Dam - Moved to delete the Produce of Dam Class at WDE. Motion Passed. The monies will go into other classes.

Katie reported on the numbers for the All-American contest. There were 125 entries in the open division and 76 in the junior division. The judge's books were all put together in-house and took a lot of time. This was to save money that was spent on the contest in the past.

Moved to allow \$500 towards the All-American contest to meet the deadline. Motion passed.

International Relations Committee

Kylie reported that we received \$28,125 in funding from USLGE for 2021.

Moved to send Brenda Gudex and Ellie Fleming to CNOG in Mexico in May 2021. Motion was passed. Ellie abstained.

Moved to allocate monies to Ryan Barrett for reverse trade mission and send Brenda to Canada as part of USLGE. Motion Passed. Mikayla Krause noted no vote.

Moved to allocate funds from USLGE of \$3500 for international promotion and \$4000 for the bull book. Motion passed.

Online Sale

Matt Henkes presented a proposal for an online sale. Moved to have an online sale March 17th – 20th with a 10 % commission fee if sold, with a \$20 entry fee for live lots and \$10 for embryos and semen. Motion passed.

Awards

The committee discussed clarification on who is eligible for awards. There needs

to be verification that those that are eligible are those that take part in Express or Milk Recording.

Moved to implement a fee of \$15 to send in DHIA page and enroll an individual cow by April 15th to be eligible for awards if not enrolled in previous year Milk Recording. Motion passed.

Moved to accept the committee recommendations for Cow of the Year to one point for each 1000 pounds over 25,000# of milk. Motion passed.

Moved that beginning with the 2021 Banquet awards, award selection will be voted on 50/50 by the past 5 recipients and the board of directors in executive session. Motion passed.

Moved to change the age to 21 – 45 years old for the Harry Clampitt Award, with the year you turn 45 to be the last year of eligibility. Motion passed.

Semen Sales

Moved that starting Jan 1st, there will be a \$50 min fee for shipping with additional charges to be billed after. Motion passed.

Type and Classification

Moved to approve the rules and guidelines and the linear descriptions. Motion passed.

The second item of business was the listing of cows presented to the classifier. Express herds state that all 1st and 2nd need to be scored and older cows are at discretion. This information will be shared with our breeders and classifiers.

Finance Committee

The committee has been working on ways to increase revenue. The fun auction will be underway in early 2021. A raffle was discussed. The Iowa Holstein Association does a calf raffle that could easily be followed by AMSS. A choice of calves or cash is the top prize.

Moved to have raffle and send the idea back to the committee for final details. Motion passed.

Office Space

The committee presented recommendations for our current office space and cost. After discussion, it was recommended that we look for smaller space and reduction of rent within the Brown Swiss office.

Moved to have Matt and Brenda visit with Brown Swiss to discuss the smaller office and reducing space. Motion passed.

Moved to raise rates for classification \$2 a head across the board for members and non-members effective April 1st. Motion passed.

Moved to raise EXPRESS fees \$2 per head for sign up as of January 1st. Motion passed.



Entries are due by May 15 and are only accessed online through google docs, payment and summary to be postmarked by May 15 for the reduced entry fee of \$10 per class. May 16 to June 1, \$15/class. More details on entry forms. NO REFUNDS, 100% of entry fees are going to premiums. Please follow directions as posted on google docs. Juniors will not be allowed to show until payment is received. If help is needed to enter please email schi-bahr1@gmail.com or visit the show's Facebook page 2020 National Junior Milking Shorthorn Show.

The link to google doc entry will be posted on the Facebook page and AMSS website.

Eligibility: Participation is open to all youth with show eligible registered Milking Shorthorns who are currently paid members of the AMSS Junior Society. Exhibitors must be a minimum of nine years old but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1st in the year competing. Those turning 21 in the current year are still eligible through December 31.

Ownership: All animals must be registered in the herd book of the American Milking Shorthorn Society (AMSS) and have registration certificates issued by the AMSS. Ownership of the animal must be recorded in AMSS herdbook in the name of the junior exhibitor(s) prior to show date. Ownership must show on the registration certificate in the name of the junior exhibitor or junior participant. Animals may be owned in partnerships; however, all members of the partnership must be paid junior members of AMSJS and animal must be owned prior to show date. Acceptable wording of Farm or other entity should read: Junior member's name of Farm name or other entity (EX: Nicholas Achen of Cherrywood Farm). All tattoos must be dry and legible upon arrival with no fresh ink and must correspond with the registration certificate. Papers will be checked prior to the show. Leased animals must have official AMSS lease form filed with the AMSS office prior to the show. The following will disqualify an animal from Junior show participation and recognition in current year: Transferring an animal in or out of a Junior's name after August 1st of the show year or adding/dropping a junior member and/or adult as an owner after the deadline.

Participation: Only one animal per exhibitor per class is allowed. Juniors may consign an animal to the National Sale and still show her in the show. Juniors will be required to follow the AMSS National Junior Show rules. A copy of the rules can be found on the AMSS website at <http://www.milking-shorthorn.com/juniors.html>.

Arrival Deadline: Cattle may begin to arrive on Tuesday, June 16th at noon, unless other arrangements have been made, and must be in place by Wednesday, June 17th at 12:00 PM CST. With prior approval, late arriving cattle must be in place 12 hours before the show. Health certificates and registration certificates must accompany the cattle. A DVM/VMD will make the final decision on health certificates and infectious diseases. Cattle are released at the conclusion of the show.

Dress: Junior exhibitors will be required to wear shirts provided by the hosting association, sponsored by STgenetics, with white pants and official entry numbers. **Note--late entrants cannot be guaranteed a shirt so please bring a white shirt to show in if you fall into this category.**

Identification: All exhibition animals must be permanently and individually identified by an acceptable method. Official identification acceptable for cattle and bison to be exhibited in Wisconsin are as follows:

- 840 tags may or may not be RFID (radio frequency identification), 15 digits, beginning with 840.
- NUES (brite) steel tags with a US Shield, this includes the orange brucellosis vaccination tag.
- 124 tags (Canadian origin tags)- 15 digit numbers the first 3 of which are "124".

Health Requirements: All cattle allowed into the grounds of the National Junior Milking Shorthorn Heifer Show must be accompanied by a current (dated May 28th or later) certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) documenting official animal identification as noted above and adherence to the Wisconsin health requirements as follows..

- No cattle are required to be brucellosis tested or vaccinated to come to fairs or shows in WI.
- Individual state requirements for tuberculosis can be found at: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx
- If you have questions or originate in Michigan's Modified Accredited Zone, call 608-224-4874 between 7:45 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. CST. Monday through Friday.

You and your veterinarian are responsible to be sure all of Wisconsin's import rules are followed for your state.

Housing Info: Pine shavings will be provided by the WMSBA junior show committee for all junior show animals.

The Jefferson Fair Park is an easy 10 minute drive from the hotels in Fort Atkinson.

AMSJS Convention Participation Agreement

To be eligible to participate at the National Milking Shorthorn Convention and in any Convention sponsored or related activities, all Junior registrants must sign this agreement and abide by the forms and rules included in this agreement.

- 1) Participants must demonstrate good citizenship and hold themselves to the highest standards of conduct at all times.
- 2) Do not engage in any behavior prohibited by national, state, or local laws.
- 3) Abide by all rules of conduct specified by the adult chaperones and advisors during activities and on bus rides.
- 4) For purpose of this agreement, the Chairman of the Host State Junior Program Committee shall have the responsibility with other representatives from the host state to oversee the fair application and enforcement of the rules for junior participants.

Procedure for misconduct of junior participant:

- a) Explain the alleged violation and present evidence of the violation to the individual involved.
- b) Provide the reported violator an opportunity to respond to his/her misbehavings.
- c) Therefore, it shall be the host state representative group to decide appropriate penalty, which may include revocation of Convention participation privileges and submit a report of the violations to the National and State Associations.
- 5) Participant and his/her parents/guardians accept financial responsibility for the cost of any damages to persons or property caused by the participant.
- 6) The use or possession of any alcoholic beverage or controlled substance is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

What is your favorite cow family in your herd & why?

If you could buy into any cow family in the breed, who would you choose & why?

Toppglen Prime's Wish-ET, EX-94 - I sold her as a Jr. 3 and didn't have anything out of her. She has really stamped out great daughters for the Old-Bankston crew. I really loved the cow, and her legacy as a tremendous brood cow is just starting.

What are the greatest achievements you've had in the Ayrshire breed & why?

The 2nd Ayrshire I ever purchased was Shiredale Phil's Susan, EX-93. She was Jr Champ at NAILE as a heifer and went on to win WDE as a 4-year-old old in 2010. The third Ayrshire I purchased was Conebella Sarge's Wendy, Nom Jr. AA 6x in milking form, Grand of the Jr. show at WDE 2011, and her daughter "Wishful Thinking" followed in her mother's footsteps being Grand of the Jr. show at WDE in 2018, reserve in 2019 and ending 2020 with a bang at NAILE. Breeding my

first EX-94 Max cows and they are full sisters.

What are your current breeding goals & why?

Every breeding is a corrective mating trying to make the next generation better than the previous in every aspect. On small numbers it makes those decisions that much more critical. Having a cow family that breeds true really helps.

What bulls are you currently using & why?

I have heifers and calves by Reagan, Champ, Kingsire, Burdette and Barclay. My best calf is a Champ so I am going back to using him. I have a pregnancy or so by Champ, Dynamic, Kingsire and Ringer

What traits do you value most for the breed & why?

Ideally, we breed for a cow that can do it all. Balanced, productive/profitable, healthy, long lived cows that can compete in herds with other breeds, and they darn well better be good because life is too short to milk ugly cows.

MEET THE

Jenny Young



When Jenny Young purchased her first Ayrshire in 2014 as a project calf for her daughter, she became hooked on her “redheads” as she affectionately refers to them. Jenny grew up with Holsteins, and then worked on other dairies before going into the dairy business on her own in 2016. She’s renting a farm in Fort Ann, NY where she houses her True-Blessings milking herd in a tie-stall barn. She’s milking around 40 cows right now, half Ayrshire, with 10 dry cows in waiting. Relying on very little part-time labor, Jenny chooses to buy most of her feed and spend her time managing the cows. She is able to utilize around 200 acres for grazing in season.

The appeal of the Ayrshire breed has grown on Jenny since her first purchase. She notes the durability, longevity, production, components, hardiness and grazing ability as positive attributes of the breed. Her goal is to have a 100 percent Ayrshire herd, and is breeding the Holsteins to Ayrshires to work towards this goal.

What is your favorite cow family in your herd and why?

I have two favorite cow families. “Princess” is the first cow I bought. She’s EX-90 2E out of an Excellent cow. I have two Ex-

cellent daughters and granddaughters out of her. “Passion” will be my first 2nd generation Excellent cow to calve in of my own breeding. The “Rosabella” cow family has nine granddaughters in my herd. She’s 10 years old and due in May. I like longevity. My vet doesn’t even think she looks 10 years old. Production is good in this family with really good components. This is the first All-American family I’ve had since I was a kid.

What are the greatest achievements you’ve had in the Ayrshire breed and why?

I’ve bred two Excellent cows from my first Ayrshire within four years of starting to milk on my own. This is a proud moment for me.

What are your current breeding goals and why?

Good production, good components and good type. I’m focusing on rear udder height and width. I want a consistent and

solid cow that will be profitable.

What traits do you value most for the breed and why?

Longevity and cows that are easy to maintain. My Ayrshires are mostly problem free compared to the other breeds in my herd. I love their temperament.

What advice would you give to young breeders just starting out?

Find bulls you like with pedigrees that you like. Talk to other breeders about these bulls to get other opinions. Sometimes I ask people I respect “What bull would you breed this cow to?” Decide what your goals are with a balance of production and type, and find bulls that fit your goals. Surround yourself with positive people to help meet your goals.
