Executive Director's Column . . .

(meaning it's a descendant of a confirmed carrier of the AM mutation and does not have an intervening descendant that is tested free), you will receive notification from the ABA that the animal must be AM tested in order to release a registration certificate. As we all get familiar with this routine of testing, we will need to be gracious with each other and accommodating where we can. I know at times this can be inconvenient if you're facing show deadlines, etc. We will do our very best to assist you through the process.

The following are some common questions and answers you may find of interest:

How do I test for AM?

I don't know about you, but I feel like I've been waiting forever for spring to arrive! One of the first signs of spring in the ABA office is the influx of registration applications in preparation for spring shows and sales. With spring comes new beginnings, and the new procedure at the ABA is the implementation of the policy for the Arthrogryposis Multiplex (AM) mutation (also known as Curly Calf).

Effective February 1st, a policy was put into place requiring the testing of offspring from potential and known carriers of AM. With change comes the need to be flexible and understanding that the process requires constant education and evaluation. I thought it might be helpful to describe the process briefly as it concerns to new registrations.

If you submit a registration application for an animal that has "impacted genetics"

selection on the Genetic Visions web site. We anticipate this feature will be available in the near future.

What if I've already genomic tested my animal, but didn't do the AM test?

If you have previously genomic tested the animal with Genetic Visions, it may be possible to request AM testing using that sample. Check with Genetic Visions to inquire if the sample is still in storage. Please keep in mind that samples are not stored indefinitely, so you may need to submit a new sample.

How long does it take for official AM results?

The standard time period is 2-3 weeks once the sample arrives at the lab.

How does the ABA get the test results?

Test results will be shared with the ABA office on a monthly basis from Genetic Visions. The purchaser of the test will receive the results as they are available. We suggest that you forward a copy of your results to the ABA office for a more timely release of your official registration certificate.

Sustainable and Profitable Farming





A wet February has left west central Ohio littered with puddles. Remnants of snow drifts create a muddy mess when completing our daily chores. While Buckeye Knoll will soon be busy gearing up for the 2022 show season, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on the beginning of my family's farm.

Located on the outskirts of Greenville, Ohio, my family resides on our seventh-generation dairy operation. My mother, Leslie, has spent time at our county courthouse going through land deeds to trace back to when our farm ground was first purchased by a Rhoades. Coming from Pennsylvania, Jacob Rhoades first called Greenville home in 1854 establishing the family farm. Jacob's son Abraham was next to take over the operation, continuing to buy the surrounding ground in 1880. The third generation of Rhoades farmers was Stephen Rhoades who took over the homestead in 1898. Construction on my family home was started in 1906 and completed in 1908. Each rock used to build the house was collected from the surrounding fields and individually hand faced. The house Stephen built is currently the home I have lived in my entire life. The newly built house and the farm was then taken over in 1919 by Stephen's son Curtis. My great-great grandfather, Fern, and his sister, Vergie, came into possession of the farm in 1955. Their son, William, was my grandpa. Mostly referred to as Bill, my

grandpa was well known around our county for serving on the fair board and for his involvement in Darke county agriculture. Even after his passing in 2013, I still am frequently asked if I have any relation to him. In 1999, my parents bought the land and moved into the family house. There are 168 years of family heritage rooted in the fields at Buckeye Knoll. For my family, dairy farming is not just a profession, it is a legacy. It is an honor and a privilege to me to be able to continue the Rhoades family tradition in the agricultural and dairy industries.

Ohio Spring Dairy Expo is the first stop for us in the show circuit. I will be counting down the days until we can all meet again in my home state. My year as queen is quickly coming to an end. My experience with the sash and crown has been a fun ride and I plan to make the most of my last few shows. Any junior member interested in becoming the next National Milking Shorthorn Queen or the new position of National Junior Ambassador, check out the applications posted on the website. Until we can all meet again, stay safe and dry throughout these upcoming wet months. See y'all soon in Illinois! ■

The AMSS National Junior Awards are presented at the AMSS National Convention.

The deadline for submission is May 15. All applications are available on the AMSS website or by contacting the national office. Candidates must be a paid junior member of the American Milking Shorthorn Junior Society.

Junior Outstanding Progressive Breeder

Awarded to two deserving youth between the ages of 9 and 21, as of January 1.

Rachel Surridge National Youth Contest

This national youth scholarship is in honor and memory of a past national office manager, Rachel Surridge.

Cindy Climer & Jim King Memorial Scholarships

Given in memory of Cindy Climer and Jim King, 2012 AMSS Co-Citizens of the Year, who both gave much of their time and energy to the service of AMSS and AMSJS memberships. Several scholarships will be awarded to eligible applicants.

Queen Contest

The Queen will have the opportunity to represent the breed during at least three national shows and national convention the following year.

Ambassador Contest

Any AMSJS member aged 16 to 21 has the opportunity to apply for the AMSJS Ambassador Contest and represent the breed.

Junior Australian Exchange Program

LIVING THE Legacy

Kyle Bonavita of Meshoppen, Pennsylvania is living a legacy. The foundation for the dreams being realized through Kyle began when his grandparents, John and Ann Bonavita, purchased a farm from John's parents in 1966, establishing Jon-Ann Farms and the prefix that has accompanied generations of superior cattle breeding.

John and Ann partnered in the farm with their children--Cindy, Cherie, Patty, Lori, John Jr., Stanley, John Jr., or Chris. Each passed within a few years of their father and never got to lead one of their own onto the colored shavings nor see their children bring home national banners.

The farm's legacy was left in the hands of the three remaining sisters--Cindy, Cherie, and Patty. Cindy and Cherie take the active role in keeping the farm and its legacy alive, continuing to breed and raise cattle for nieces and nephews to show in honor of the Jon-Ann name.

Kyle, age 20, is the last of his generation eligible to compete as a youth. The opportunity to be the one to enter the farm's cattle on a national stage is something he doesn't take for granted.

His first trip to a national show was in 2019, when he entered Jon-Ann Charismas T Cherie in the International Guernsey Junior show at World Dairy Expo. The heifer was out of a Four Winds Destiny's Child calf purchased for him by his father and grandfather in 2015. "This was the first heifer out of the calf that Dad and Grandpa bought for me," Kyle said. She stood second in her class in both junior and open shows, was reserve champion of the junior show, and repeated the performance at North American International Livestock Exposition (NAILE) a few weeks later.

Kyle returned with Milking Shorthorns



in 2020 at NAILE, with offspring of cows previously shown by a cousin who aged out of youth shows. Jon-Ann Roses Real Deal stood second in both open and junior shows as a winter calf.

In 2021, winter calf Jon-Ann Delux Rosa Bean joined Jon-Ann Roses Deal, now a winter yearling, in the show string for World Dairy Expo and NAILE. The winter calf placed first in the junior show and third in open. The winter yearling placed second in youth and third in open and was honorable mention junior champion of the junior show. "Over the next few weeks, the heifers really developed," Kyle said. The winter calf won both open and youth classes and was junior champion and best bred and owned of each show. Jon-Ann Roses Deal placed first in open and youth classes and was honorable mention of both NAILE shows.

These consistent placings are proof for the family that the dreams of a previous generation can become a reality.

Ben Cashell of Cashell's Cattle Care has been instrumental in developing heifers for Jon-Ann Farms. "Cindy gets a solid start on the calves, and it has just been fun to work with them," Ben said. "Every year they trust us with the cream of the crop from their calves. We as a team at Cashell's Cattle Care, get the joy of riding along and helping chase the banners." He continued, "This success with Kyle has been a lot of fun for them, and it's been very emotional wins for the sisters. The family prefix really matters to them. I am truly excited for them as a family."

Kyle is grateful to the Cashell team for their work in heifer development. "If it wasn't for Ben, I wouldn't be here with this success," Kyle said. "Cashell Cattle Care

Team has been there every step of the way. They are great people to work with. They've had their share of success and take pride in it." He also appreciates his friend Brooke Calkin who is always there to lend a hand at shows.

Outside of showing cattle, Kyle's proudest accomplishment is earning Eagle Scout in 2019. He participated in Key Club, Future Business Leaders of America, Student Council, and Prom Steering Committee in high school.

For now, Kyle is taking it one day at a time and preparing for spring shows.

While he doesn't see himself as the future farm operator, he hopes to build his own path and be an example to other kids. "You might come from a small farm, but if you work hard, you can definitely accomplish your goals, it doesn't matter where you come from," he said.

In the meantime, he is grateful for the humbling opportunity he's enjoyed. "It was unexpected and one of those things you don't take for granted. NAILE was a very emotional show. It just gives you the feeling that everything you've done in the past, and keeping the farm, it's been worth it."

Charlotte, and Ethan and niece Addison Pollard help care for calves. They always had Red and White Holsteins, so Milking Shorthorn semen was selected to settle hard breeding cows. After talking with Dave Kendall at World Dairy Expo, the resulting calves were registered and enrolled in the EXPRESS program.

What is your favorite cow family in your herd and why?

We really don't have a favorite, we have many different breeding lines in the herd right now.

What are your current breeding goals and why?

We like to have a balanced Shorthorn cow to be competitive with our commercial Holstein cows (Holstein tank average: 90 lbs/day with 4.2%fat and 3.2% protein with 32% 21-day pregnancy rate). Some of our Shorthorn cows calve in and reach peak milk along with the Holsteins, but none can maintain it longer than one milk test. At the same time, we recognize that Shorthorn herd average will never exceed the Holstein average, so we are hesitant to give up type.



Also, we noticed many Shorthorn breeders do not prefer roan and white colored animals and have tried to select roan and white bulls from backgrounds with type and production to create a niche within the breed for our small herd.

What bulls are you currently using and why?

Lands-Brook Comanche, Spring Meadows LS Casper P, and Gold Mine STC Gunnar EXP are most heavily used recently in line with our breeding goals. In the past year, individual matings were made to Innisfail Jekyl EXP, GMC Innisfail Pistol Pete, Mericrest Outlaw and GI2 Gold Mine S War Paint, because we thought the resulting calf would be a good balanced animal.

What traits do you value most for the breed and why?

We value the genetic expansion program. We can create new Shorthorn families from within our current herd. The fact that in two generations we can have an EXP calf was paramount to us choosing the Milking Shorthorn breed to add to the herd.

AUBURNDALE, Wis. – Ayrshires first came to the Offer's Auburndale, Wisconsin family farm 70 years ago, and they have been a mainstay ever since.

For his lifelong pursuit of breeding registered Ayrshires, John Offer was named the Wisconsin Ayrshire Breeders' Distinguished Breeder of the Year at their state meeting held in March in Tomah, Wisconsin.

in the showing and typically exhibit at the Midwest Regional Ayrshire Show, the Central Wisconsin State Fair and World Dairy Expo. To keep working towards their goals, the Offers have focused their breeding program on selecting for sound functional type.

"We really want to breed cows that can last a long time," John said. "To do that, they need to have good udders and sound feet and legs. That is where we place our focus."

The Offer's diligence with their breeding program has paid off with some impressive showing accolades collected by members of their small herd. They have collected 17 All-American nominations and numerous Junior All-American nominations.

One current herd favorite is Honey-Dew Dreamer Ellie EX-91. As Hunter's junior project, Ellie has been nominated Junior All-American four times, three of which were in milking form. The Offers say that they owe a lot to the Ayrshire cow.

"The Ayrshire cow is the rock that our farm is built on. Without Ayrshires in our barn, it is hard to imagine what our lives would be like," John said. "She has given us so much, and she continues to provide for our family and give our children great opportunities." ■





Champaign County Fairgrounds, 601 Fairview Ave, Urbana, IL 61801

Entries are due by May 15. Payment and summary to be postmarked by May 15 for the reduced entry fee of \$10 per class. May 16 to June 1, \$15/ class. NO REFUNDS, 100% of entry fees are going to premiums. Juniors will not be allowed to show until payment is received. Entries will be held until payment arrives. If help is needed to enter please contact Samantha Ropp Fairbank (815-419-5701) or visit Junior Facebook page 2022 National Junior Milking Shorthorn Show. Entries online only. Entry fees to Clint Cribbet, 478 CR 1650N, Bethany, IL 61914; phone: 217-853-0832. **The link for entry will be posted on the Facebook page and AMSS website.** Checks should be made to Illinois Milking Shorthorn Society.

Eligibility: Participation is open to all youth with show eligible registered Milking Shorthorns who are currently paid members of the AMSS Junior Society. Exhibitors must be a minimum of nine years old but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1st in the year competing. Those turning 21 in the current year are still eligible through December 31.

Ownership: All animals must be registered in the herd book of the American Milking Shorthorn Society (AMSS) and have registration certificates issued by the AMSS. Ownership of the animal must be recorded in AMSS herdbook in the name of the junior exhibitor(s) prior to show date. Ownership must show on the registration certificate in the name of the junior exhibitor or junior participant. Animals may be owned in partnerships; however, all members of the partnership must be paid junior members of AMSS and animal must be owned prior to show date. Acceptable wording of Farm or other entity should read: Junior member's name of Farm name or other entity (EX: Nicholas Achen of Cherrywood Farm). All tattoos must be dry and legible upon arrival with no fresh ink and must correspond with the registration certificate. Papers will be checked prior to the show. Leased animals must have official AMSS lease form filed with the AMSS office prior to the show. The following will disqualify an animal from Junior show participation and recognition in current year: Transferring an animal in or out of a Junior's name after August 1st of the show year or adding/dropping a junior member and/or adult as an owner after the deadline.

Participation: Only one animal per exhibitor per class is allowed. Juniors may consign an animal to the National Sale and still show her in the show. Juniors will be required to follow the AMSS National Junior Show rules. A copy of the rules can be found on the AMSS website at <http://www.milking-shorthorn.com/juniors.html>.

Arrival Deadline: Cattle may begin to arrive on Wednesday, June 22nd unless other arrangements have been made, or permission has been granted by show chairperson, and must be in place by Wednesday, June 22nd at 4:00 PM CST. Health certificates and registration certificates must accompany the cattle. A DVM/VMD will make the final decision on health certificates and infectious diseases. Cattle are released at the conclusion of the show.

Dress: Junior exhibitors will be required to wear shirts provided by the hosting association, sponsored by STGenetics, with white pants and official entry numbers. ****Note: Late entrants cannot be guaranteed a shirt so please bring a white shirt to show in if you fall into this category.****

Identification: All exhibition animals must be permanently and individually identified by an acceptable method. Official identification acceptable for cattle and bison to be exhibited in Illinois are as follows:

- 840 tags may or may not be RFID (radio frequency identification), 15 digits, beginning with 840.
- NUES (brite) steel tags with a US Shield, this includes the orange brucellosis vaccination tag.
- 124 tags (Canadian origin tags)- 15 digit numbers the first 3 of which are "124".

Health Requirements: All cattle allowed into the grounds of the National Junior Milking Shorthorn Heifer Show must be accompanied by a current (dated May 28th or later) certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) documenting official animal identification as noted above and adherence to the Illinois health requirements as follows..

- No cattle are required to be brucellosis tested or vaccinated to come to fairs or shows in IL.
- Individual state requirements for tuberculosis can be found at: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx
- You and your veterinarian are responsible to be sure all of Illinois' import rules are followed for your state.

Housing Info: All bedding will be provided by the Baxter family for all junior show animals. Hay will be available for purchase.

AMSJS Convention Participation Agreement

To be eligible to participate at the National Milking Shorthorn Convention and in any Convention sponsored or related activities, all Junior registrants must sign this agreement and abide by the forms and rules included in this agreement.

- 3) Abide by all rules of conduct specified by the adult chaperones and advisors during activities and on bus rides.
- 4) For purpose of this agreement, the Chairman of the Host State Junior Program Committee shall have the responsibility with other representatives from the host state to oversee the fair application and enforcement of the rules for junior participants.

Procedure for misconduct of junior participant:

- a) Explain the alleged violation and present evidence of the violation to the individual involved.
- b) Provide the reported violator an opportunity to respond to his/her misbehaviors.
- c) Therefore, it shall be the host state representative group to decide appropriate penalty, which may include revocation of Convention participation privileges and submit a report of the violations to the National and State Associations.
- 5) Participant and his/her parents/guardians accept financial responsibility for the cost of any damages to persons or property caused by the participant.
- 6) The use or possession of any alcoholic beverage or controlled substance is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

Meeting Minutes

Winter AMSS Board of Directors Meeting

December 3 & 4, 2021

The Winter Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President Marcia Clark at 7:30 am at the Hampton Inn, Beloit, Wisconsin.

In attendance: Marcia Clark, Susan Lee, Katie Agnew, Eddie Hartfield, Matt Borchardt (late), Matt Henkes, Allen Hess, Joanna Landrum, Larry Landsgard, Jerry Merrill, Michelle Upchurch (Dec 4 by phone)

Kylie Preisinger moved to accept the minutes from the Tuesday, October 26, 2021 Board meeting. Jerry Merrill seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Marcia Clark gave the President's report focusing on the many good things of the year.

Brenda Gudex presented the Executive Secretaries report. Transfers are up with 951 and Express Program is down a bit in cow numbers. We have 487 Adult members and 800 Junior members. Results were returned on 93 Males and 80 Females along with 63 Genomic tests. AMSS website is being worked on and timetable met. ABRI has access to the AMSS database with some reports being sent to them. The monthly conference calls have been a great help and the board has received more timely reporting from some committees.

Reports

Endowment: The endowment committee report from Nedra Koller was shared. A CD was closed, and monies were transferred to the account in Beloit.

Juniors: The Board discussed the usage of the Alternate Leadsperson Form.

Matt Henkes moved to send the form back to the Juniors for a concrete proposal to approve by February meeting. Kylie Preisinger seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Suggested items for Juniors to consider:

1. The Board would like to see a continuation of an Alternate Leadsperson Form
2. Would like high consideration that the junior member actually shows the animal at some point within the show season
3. If qualifying shows come into play, list of what shows, what is needed from the show to verify who showed the animal.
4. Should it be for only National Shows
5. No age requirements

Brenda discussed having a Junior representative at each National Show. One Junior should be appointed as a point of contact. This individual might be responsible for gathering Juniors together for a photo or a group meal.

International: Kylie Preisinger report-

ed for the International Committee.

The International committee recommends that AMSS continues the membership within USLGE.

Kylie Preisinger moved to continue the membership at \$5500 per year. Allen Hess seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Kylie Preisinger moved for inbound USLGE travel for representatives from the UK, Australia and Canada for the 2022 National Convention. Matt Henkes seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Susan Lee moved to send Brenda Gudex and Matt Henkes to Canada in the summer of 2022 for the Canadian National Meeting. Eddie Hartfield seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Eddie Hartfield moved to send Ellie Fleming and Kylie Preisinger to Mexico to CNOG. Michelle Upchurch seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Kylie Preisinger moved to send Ellie Fleming and a 2nd individual to Ecuador. Eddie Hartfield seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The international committee presented three bulls for herdbook recommendations as outlined in AMSS policy.

1. AUS Glenclyffe JP Jedi - 53.9% - recommended at GE
2. AUS Glenbrook Queens Prince Germosh - 49.4% - recommended at GE
3. AUS Gorbo Storm Hunt - 28% - recommended at GI

Matt Henkes moved to approve bulls at the recommended herdbook levels. Katie Agnew seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Type and Classification: Michelle Upchurch gave the Type and Classification report. The committee reviewed the wording for the classification per lactation within the EXPRESS program. The following information was discussed:

Classification:

- 1st lactation animals scored more than once within their lactation will be charged \$16.
- 2nd lactation animals scored more than once within their lactation will be charged \$16.
- All 3rd plus lactation animals will be charged \$16
- A second tour within a year the minimum fee will apply or \$16 per head (whichever is greater)

Susan Lee moved to change the bull classification to minimum age of 12 months with a max score available of 89 points. After 18 months of age there is no maximum score with no previous score needed. Michelle Upchurch seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The Board discussed the increase in

classification costs as well as information from other breeds on their programming. The Board agreed it was good business practice to get proposals from other breeds to include:

1. Interest of programming
2. Fee sheet
3. Complete proposal (stop charge/per cow fee/minimum number of cows needed for classification/etc.)

Bull Book

Allen Hess will be working with Matt Henkes on this year's bull book. The bull book did receive USLGE reimbursement of \$1598.67 for international exposure.

Genetics

The Genetics committee brought forth a young sire sampling program, similar to what AMSS has had in the past. This will be a project that will be examined closer in the future. The AMSS semen tanks were also discussed. Katie Agnew goes above and beyond assisting the society with this venture. There was also discussion around the increased cost of liquid nitrogen.

Kylie Preisinger moved that starting January 1, a \$25 handling fee will be added to all shipments out of the AMSS tank. Matt Borchardt seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Kylie Preisinger moved to enter into a one-year contract with Katie Agnew for handling of semen from the AMSS tank at a rate of \$500. Matt Henkes seconded motion. Motion passed. Katie Agnew abstained.

Susan Lee moved to add genotyping the dam of any National Show Champion that is alive at AMSS expense. Kylie Preisinger seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The Board discussed offering space in the AMSS tanks for international semen. Kylie Preisinger will send out invites to international contacts to see if there is interest. Ryan Barrett has been in contact with AMSS about the availability of bulls. Brenda is compiling information to send to Ryan.

John Cole joined the Board at 2:30pm to discuss Genomics and DNA. This was an interesting presentation for all. John gave insight on our DNA and genomic process moving forward. Susan Lee will remain in contact with John and his contacts for more information on how AMSS can create a larger database.

Convention

The Board received reports from the Wisconsin, Illinois and OK/AR/TX conventions.

The Board is seeking a host for 2024's

convention. Iowa is interested in hosting, just further in the future.

Website, Promo, History

Joanna reported for the committee. A new website was shown to the Board. Joanna and Brenda will continue to work with Christy Achen on this project.

Overall, the Angle work has been good. We waited longer than normal for paper to print the last issue.

National Show

Katie Agnew gave the National Show report. The judge's application was presented. The wording will include resume instead of application as this will be just a reference listing for our members.

There was also discussion of sponsorship for the National Futurity. While participation in actual entries continue to increase, actual participation in the Futurity is small. There is an understanding that numerous factors cause this, but an increase in payout may encourage more entries.

The Board discussed the All-American Contest. A breeder approached the Board with an idea to implement a best bred and owned animal. The discussion regarding rules at all National shows for bred and owned as some discrepancies. AMSS will send out wording for all National Shows. Only registration papers by AMSS are considered official.

Katie Agnew and Matt Henkes reported on the World Dairy Expo meeting. There are schedule changes moving forward for all breed shows. There was discussion at the meeting to move Senior Three-Year Olds to the Senior Champion class. The Board agreed that they would prefer to leave as is. There will be more discussion at a future WDE meeting.

Finance

The Board discussed cost increases for the classification program as presented by Brown Swiss.

Matt Henkes moved to increase the classification rates due to the increased cost from Brown Swiss. The new rates as follows as of April 1, 2022.

Member Fees: \$135 min fee, \$75 multibreed, \$16 per cow

Non-Member Fees: \$160 min fee, \$30 per cow

Susan Lee seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The finance committee discussed a raffle to raise funds for AMSS. This idea was postponed previously due to other Milking Shorthorn raffles being held.

Eddie Hartfield moved to do a raffle with end at the National Convention. Kylie Preisinger seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Brenda provided the Board with an output of information used to calculate awards for AMSS. The list was quite lengthy and not always easily deciphered.

Susan Lee moved that all awards be based on actual (not mature equivalents or adjusted values) information when the information is available. Second by Kylie Preisinger. Motion Passed.

Kylie Preisinger shared information for the percentage project. We will reach out to Doug Wherry to see if he is interested in chairing the committee.

Kylie Preisinger will continue to move forward with the percentage project. We will be updating the back of the pedigrees to delete the percentage relation to herdbook level.

Kylie Preisinger moved to accept all reports as presented. Second by Eddie Hartfield. Motion passed.

Old Business

The Board discussed ID policies and 840/RFID tag usage. It was decided to continue to promote the correct identification needs for AMSS and remind individuals that those may be different from exhibition or sale needs.

Matt Henkes and Susan Lee will work on a breed protest form for AMSS cases. The Board discussed anonymous protests.

Kylie Preisinger moved to approve all actions in Executive Sessions. Second by Katie Agnew. Motion passed.



(and their children Ainsley, Charlotte, and Ethan; and niece Addison), of Rockford, IL started farming with Brent's parents, Warren and Gail in 2005 until they retired in 2012. Milking Shorthorns were initially added to the herd by settling hard-to-breed Holsteins. Those initial animals were enrolled in the AMSS EXPRESS program and grew to today where the small herd of Shorthorns is expected to compete with the type and 27,000 rolling herd average of their commercial Holstein herdmates.

KINGSDALE FARMS

of Oneida, IL was established in 1906, with Milking Shorthorns added in 1917. Keith and Lillian King were married in 1934 and built up a sizable and notable dairy herd. Their son Jerry King continues involvement with the breed by boarding bred heifers in a

breeding stock from breeders such as Arnold Kohley of Lisle, Illinois; Emmet Arnold's Sunnyside Farm in Rock County, Wisconsin; John C. Gage of Eudora, Kansas; and W. Arthur Simpson of Lyndonville, Vermont. We owe much to the efforts of these dedicated breeders that came before us. Kenneth's widow, Winifred, and their daughter Martha Hoffman Kerestes continue breeding and milking traditional Milking Shorthorns with both milk and meat traits.

CRIBBET FARMS MILKING SHORTHORNS herd in Bethany, Illinois was established in the early 1930s by HC Harry Cribbet and his sons, Max, Rex, Richard, and Myron. Over the years they showed at many state and county fairs and the International in Chicago, having champion Milking Shorthorn steer in the 1940s at Chicago International Show and champion bull at the Illinois State fair in 1941. The herd continued on with Max Cribbet and his sons Greg, Brad and Steve. Today the herd is run by Brad along with his son Clint Cribbet and his children Calvin and Daisy. The herd consists of around 20 brood cows and 10 heifers.

Clint Cribbet is the Illinois state Milking Shorthorn president and past national director for 11 years. Our family continues to show at county fairs, state fairs and national shows. Over the years our farm has produced many All Americans and one national grand champion bull. The Cribbets would like to welcome everyone to this year's national Milking Shorthorn convention of 2022 in Champaign, IL.

of Earville, Illinois was established in 1936 by John E. and Rosa Hoffman, who started married life milking eight Milking Shorthorns for a cream route. Their sons Gerald and Kenneth built up the dairy herd considerably in the 1950s and 1960s with

FROM ROGER STANLEY, Effingham, IL: About 1917, a few farmers around Ingraham, Illinois including Cyrus William Stanley formed a union called "The Ingraham S. H. B. A." The group decided that a dual-purpose breed would benefit them all so they purchased a pure-bred Shorthorn bull, Cyrus Duke, from the herd of May & Otis, Willoughby, Ohio for \$300. [That would be \$6500 in today's dollars.]

Cy also bought Spotted Lady 2d and her heifer calf in 1917 from Tom Geffs, Yale, Illinois. Cy then built upon and improved his herd with the help of his wife, Sallie, and their thirteen children.

In the 1920s, C. W. Stanley and Sons began showing their cattle at the surrounding fairs, then broadening their show circuit to include other state fairs and national shows, selling their breeding stock and winning many blue ribbons. Two of Cy's sons, Fletcher 'Red' and Nelson 'Curly', continued breeding and showing Milking Shorthorns under the name Stanley Brothers. Four generations of the Stanley family raising and showing Milking Shorthorn cattle ended in the 1990s.

TRIPLE S GENETICS started in 2002 as a 4-H project for Samantha, Savannah, and Sadie Ropp. We originally started with Jerseys and then branched off to Milking Shorthorns in 2005 with encouragement from George Halpin. 

MARKETING AYRSHIRES IN TODAY'S WORLD OF SOCIAL MEDIA



Harold Deering

In today's world, marketing comes in many shapes, sizes and formats. Add in the pandemic, and the merchandising landscape has become even more varied. Harold Deering from Honor-Roll Farm in Bridport, Vermont found himself in a scenario many in the dairy industry have faced. His family's facilities were dated and over-crowded, and the older generation was looking forward to retirement. The difficult decision was made to sell the farm, so the dairy herd had to be sold.

At the time the choice was made to liquidate the farm, the Deerings had 250 cows, which included 85 milking Ayrshires and Milking Shorthorns. Harold was learning through Facebook that there was a grow-

ing population of dairy herds interested in adding Ayrshires and Milking Shorthorns, so he got to work!

Harold became skilled at Facebook marketing by trial and error. The initial goal was to sell each Ayrshire and Milking Shorthorn individually as she peaked, which gave him the flexibility to always be selling his best. The decision was made to sell the Holsteins all together as one group to a private buyer. To their surprise, all of the Ayrshires and Milking Shorthorns were sold before the Holsteins ever left the farm!

Treating people right and responding quickly to requests for information has served Harold well. When it was all over, Harold privately sold 111 Ayrshires and 25 Milking Shorthorns in 11 months. The Ayrshires were sold in 11 states and Canada. He had at least eight buyers who made initial purchases come back for more later. Before starting his marketing campaign, Harold chose to sell 14 for beef and kept a few to stay involved in the industry he loves.

When asked why his buyers were interested in the Ayrshire breed, Harold said frankly, that wasn't even part of the discussion. He found that buyers were reaching out to him because they absolutely wanted Ayrshires, and not that he was selling them on the breed.

Harold says he held each of the three breeds on their farm to the same standards. He easily shared his personal feelings on the Ayrshire breed with anyone who asked,

proclaiming the breed's hardiness, longevity, strong feet and legs, and great day-to-day function. He added that he likes the personality of Milking Shorthorns.

One of Harold's favorites, and maybe the cow that put Honor-Roll Ayrshires on the map, is Honor-Roll Traveler Tacey 946, EX-94 3E. "Tacey" changed hands a couple times in her early show career until Peter Vail of Englewood, FL, became her final owner. She was a Jr. Champion at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, Reserve All-American, Reserve Sr. Champion at the Mid-Atlantic National Show and made 23,060M 4.4% 1009F 3.3% 760P in 305 days as a 5-year-old.

Harold has great appreciation for all of his buyers and the confidence they've shown in his Honor-Roll breeding. He's thankful to each client for giving his animals great homes and enjoys the follow-up he's heard from many on their success stories.

Lewis Catlett of Kimbolton, OH, says he was initially drawn to the show appeal of the Honor-Roll Ayrshires. He was looking for a show heifer for his daughter and saw Harold's posts

on a few different platforms. He ended up purchasing several animals and has had good success with the genetics he purchased from Harold as the Ayrshire milk quality fits in well with his business goals. Catlett's Stone Wall Dairy is the sole supplier of milk to Black Radish Creamery that markets specialty cheeses in Columbus, OH.

"Harold was persuasive," Victoria Hostetler of McClure, PA, laughingly ex-

Harold is quick to share what he learned from his experiences marketing on Facebook:

- Don't post ads if you don't have multiple, current pictures available.
- Be honest about what you're selling – to yourself and to others! That's what keeps buyers coming back.
- Don't post ads if you're short on time that day. Wait a day or two if you won't be able to respond to requests quickly. If you're not serious, your buyer won't be either.
- Keep your posts short. You can add more information if people have questions.
- If you post the same animal more than once, be sure to change the ad and don't use the same photo.
- If you think your animals have value, buyers will too!
- Think strategically. Don't put too much pedigree information in the first post so that you can add more in a later post if needed.
- Make short videos of your animal moving. Don't cut off parts of her as it looks like you're hiding something.
- Find out what the goal is for the buyer. The animal they reached out about might not be the right fit, yet another one you have might be perfect.
- Don't be afraid to ask for a holding fee/security deposit.
- Clipping animals and using before and after photos helps.

plained. She said that after reading some Facebook ads and talking with Harold, her husband made the trip to Vermont to look over the herd. He owned a few Ayrshires in the past, so it wasn't a huge leap when he purchased some and introduced them to their Holstein herd mates. Her daughter was excited to exhibit the Ayrshire grand champion and reserve grand champion locally last summer. Victoria says, "Overall, the Ayrshires have done very well and are holding their own with our Holsteins."

There's definitely a pattern to the comments made from buyers of Honor-Roll cattle. Perhaps the most compelling testimonial comes from Rich Hamker of Oberlin, OH. Rich says, "Being new to the breed, we didn't know where to go for Ayrshire genetics, and we happened to see Harold's Facebook posts. Harold is a great salesman and is very personable. He's very responsive and gave us great photos. He answered all of our questions and is a wealth of knowledge. He's so genuine; you know he's selling what he believes in." Rich said that Harold has kept up with their progress with his animals and has introduced them to many others active in the Ayrshire breed.

How can you doubt a guy who's had this kind of success?

Harold summed up his thoughts, saying, "Always be mindful of what you post on Facebook. You never know what influences a potential buyer. If people don't respect you as a person, they won't buy from you."

That's not just good marketing; that's a life lesson.

Harold's journey of marketing animals in the Facebook world hasn't ended with his own herd. He continues his efforts today helping others buy and sell cattle through social media.
