



Katie Schmitt joined the Council on Dairy Cattle Breeding in the spring of 2023 as the Outreach Specialist to support Ayrshire and Milking Shorthorn breeders and the Dairy Breed Improvement Collaboration.

We’ve likely all heard this age-old adage. That pledge is guiding the Council of Dairy Cattle Breeding (CDCB) as we work to strengthen our partnership to help you, as Ayrshire and Milking Shorthorn breeders, achieve your genetic vision and goals.

This summer, I traveled across the country attending national breed conventions while many CDCB colleagues presented at the American Dairy Science Association in Ottawa, Ontario. At each convention, we discussed current research, improvements coming to dairy cattle genetics, and the importance of farm data. In my role as CDCB Outreach Specialist, I had another mission in mind. Surrounded by dairy cattle breeders, I made it a priority to listen more than I spoke.

When I did this, I learned incredible insights from breeders. Your Ayrshire and Milking Shorthorn associations welcomed me with open arms and displayed a deep desire to continue the breeds’ genetic progress. I asked those in attendance at the annual meeting to complete a brief survey to share their thoughts and experiences with CDCB. All breeders can complete the 10-minute survey for a chance to win \$100 here <https://form.jotform.com/231566188631158> or by scanning the QR code. The results of this survey will help guide CDCB into the future, so I thank

you for your time and insight.

During the annual meeting, I also spoke about the Dairy Breed Improvement Collaboration that your associations are involved in through CDCB. The collaboration focuses on the breeds of Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, and Milking Shorthorn, and it is best explained through the three key objectives of the project.

Objective #1

Facilitate greater participation in programs that support breed improvement – identification, registration, type classification, dairy herd improvement (DHI), genomic testing, and NAAB cross reference. This objective is designed to increase the reliability of evaluations for these breeds through increased data collection and data flow.

Objective #2

Offer value-driven access to CDCB genomic evaluations for bulls of smaller-population breeds. To accomplish this, CDCB is subsidizing \$400 of the \$800 AI Service Fee assigned to US-born Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, and Guernsey bulls who are marketed using their genomic evaluation. Milking Shorthorn is excluded from this objective because genomics have not yet been developed for the breed, therefore the fee is not applied to Milking Shorthorn bulls.

Objective #3

Provide technical support in genetic improvement strategies through the development of a full-time outreach position at CDCB.

In support of the Dairy Breed Improvement Collaboration, all breed associations involved (U.S. Ayrshire Breeders’ Association, National Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders’ Association, American Guernsey Association, and American Milking Shorthorn Society) have formally agreed to adopt the following practices:

1. AI bulls must be genotyped to be registered by the association.
2. Progeny of AI bulls can only be registered if the sire enrolls in the NAAB cross reference program.
3. AI bull’s dam and sire must be registered.

While this season of breed conventions has been an incredible asset in establishing healthy feedback loops between dairy producers and the genetic evaluation system cared for by CDCB, our work is not done. The next step is to take this “informal” data gathered at your convention and combine it with survey data you provide so that CDCB can better serve you, your breed, and the dairy community. I look forward to what we can accomplish together through the Dairy Breed Improvement Collaboration and beyond!

3. A Canadian entry which qualifies under these rules at a U.S. show may enter. Only U.S. placings shall be listed on the

entry form.

4. Judges may declare "no contest" for any class in which the numbers and/or quality of photographs would justify such action.
5. First place fall national show winners will no longer be considered as automatic nominations.

Any entry not adhering to the above rules will be returned to the exhibitor.

Photographs:

1. **Entry must be accompanied by one unretouched (including background) glossy professional photograph (no negatives) 5 x 7 in size or high resolution photographer digital scan.** Photo must have been taken during the 2023 calendar year and show the entry in substantially the same stage of development or lactation as when judged. **Photo must represent the class she was shown in & AA contest entry class.** Photo may be sent directly to the ABA by the photographer.
2. The picture must be identified with the complete name of

animal. If mailed, heavy cardboard will ensure safe delivery. The photo will not be returned except by request and will remain on file at the ABA office.

3. Responsibility for obtaining and paying for photos of each entry and delivery to the ABA within the specified time rests entirely upon the exhibitor. If the photo is on file at The Angle, please specify.

Photos, fees and entry forms must arrive to the ABA by the deadlines announced!

Judging:

1. Official judges will consist of a panel of the national show judges, two judges from the largest state or regional shows per ABA region and one at-large judge.

2. A point system of 1 through infinity will be used for judging, with the low score determining the winner. In the event of a tie, the most number 1 votes wins.

Junior 3-Year-Old: Born after Feb. 28, 2020, and before Sept. 1, 2020

Senior 3-Year-Old: Born after Aug. 31, 2019, and before March 1, 2020

4-Year-Old: Born after Aug. 31, 2018, and before Sept. 1, 2019

5-Year-Old: Born after Aug. 31, 2017, and before Sept. 1, 2018

Aged Cow: Born before Sept. 1, 2017

Lifetime Component Merit: Lifetime production over 100,000 lbs. milk or produced 7,500 combined pounds of fat and protein. Official milk production test records are required.

Outstanding Young Breeder

Like many farm kids, this young Milking Shorthorn breeder spent their childhood surrounded by small town, rural America. The hometown has hovered around 1,000 residents for the past several decades. While they may have grown up a small town, farm kid, this kid had a curiosity and thirst for knowledge that led them to all corners of the world after college: Peru, New Zealand, Australia, and Russia.

It wasn't until his dad was ready to quit, after three generations of family farmers, that he realized he wanted to come home. He wanted to continue the legacy his great-grandfather started in the early 1900's.

The young breeder admitted that after working on several farms overseas, it wasn't until he left his family's operation that he began to understand how food was produced and moved from the farm to the consumer. Wanting to make a difference, he applied the mindset, "Think globally, Act locally." That is when he decided to return to his roots and expand his family's farm ... and the idea of keeping the tradition that had been started by those who had come before him.

He returned to the farm in 2014 and began to help manage their herd of Milking Shorthorn. He believes they do well in a grazing operation where the cows have a good lifespan and calve easily. In addition to the dairy herd, they contribute to the state's growing "local food" movement by raising tomatoes, potatoes and okra.

girl in the world

"I am the luckiest girl in the world – To be with the cattle and to go to so many places with them and to be on the farm my whole life." -Shirley Harris

Shirley Harris' father, Mike Weidner, began the herd in 1929 and began going to the state fair (Illinois in 1933). When Shirley was young, Mike had three herds at various fairs around the country. One as far away as the Cow Palace in San Francisco. He had a white herd, a red herd, and a roan herd.

The love for Milking Shorthorn came from an early age. Shirley would often ask her daddy (as she called him) if she could go with him to look at the cows and most of the time he would say, "yes." They would look at the cattle and try to decide who was going to the fairs.

Even at five years old, and with a broken arm, she showed her heifer in 1940 with a sling.

Shirley was particularly devoted to the bulls. When asked why she said, "When the cattle do as well as they do, you want to keep that going." The bulls became her passion. And one, Prairie Monster, was undefeated even at his last show at the Illinois State Fair. At that time, the bull was 19 years old. "Winning makes you want to keep winning bull classes and breeding champions," said Shirley.

In 1980 her father was physically not able to maintain the herd and was considering selling the cattle. Shirley said, "Oh Daddy you can't do that, let me take over the herd." Mike asked, "Do you think you can do it?" Shirley said, "I know I can." He said, "I know you can too!"

Forty-three years later, Shirley still has 60 head of Milking Shorthorns and Weidner Prairie Farms has had 36 National Grand Champions. The competition was always a driving force for her winning. She has also said, "If I could, I would do it all over again. All I need to know about life, I learned from a cow."

MATRIARCH RAKES IN AWARDS FROM SEVEN DECADES OF SHOWING

DALTON City, Ill. — Mike Weidner started showing his Milking Shorthorn cattle at the Illinois State Fair in 1934, one year before his curly-headed daughter, Shirley, was born.

She was destined to take his business to success beyond his dreams.

By the time the energetic girl turned 5 years old, she was showing at the state fair.

“Daddy let me. I was just as happy as can be,” says Shirley Harris, now 84.

She points to a photo of herself, competing with her arm in a cast at her first state show in 1940. This treasured black and white photo is part of a banner for the 2019 Illinois State Fair celebrating Weidner Prairie Farm’s 85th year of showing cattle at the fair in Springfield, Ill.

They have not missed a single year. And, yes, they are making plans for the 2020 state fair in August.

Banner Years

The celebration banner shows other important stages in the farm’s history, including photos of Harris’ dad with his first Milking Shorthorn heifer and first bull of the same breed in 1929. He chose this breed over Holsteins in part because they brought more money at sales and were still good milkers, she says.

While the family stopped milking the dairy cattle years ago, Shirley continues the legacy of breeding and showing. She showed the cattle in the ring for more than seven and a half decades, and she still plays a big role in choosing the best ones.

“She still picks the cattle we show,” says Eric Cheever, her herdsman.

By 1966, she had won so many trophies and banners, she and her husband Bill built a shed to house them. Today the display shed holds thousands of pieces of memorabilia — ribbons, trophies, old milking cans and even a lamp that lights up showing a 1951 Indiana State Fair championship bull.

“I wouldn’t change my life for anything,” says Harris, whose work with livestock afforded her the opportunity to see much of the country.

The awards in this room are from state fairs and championship shows across the nation. The sight, upon entering the room awash with ribbons and trophies, is breathtaking.

Still, the packed shed only holds a portion of her winning ribbons, Cheever says. Only champion and first place ribbons make the grade to be on display. Harris has trunks full of other ribbons stored away.

“These awards represent years of work — sweat, blood and tears,” Cheever says.

Cheever, Harris and her son, Bill Fiesler, a dentist in Decatur, Illinois, have spent dozens of hours sorting and restoring the awards hall. Even though they are out of space again, they keep winning. The 18 winning ribbons of 2019 take up a table of their own. Prestigious World Dairy Expo trophies from Wisconsin in 1987, 1988 and 1995 huddle together in gleaming silver in another part of the victory hall.

Some memorable events are recorded in racks of newspaper clippings. One rack is devoted to the year Weidner Prairie Farm hosted the Farm Progress Show in 1991, before the show’s permanent biennial Illinois site was established in Decatur.

Proving Herself

One day which still stands out in her memory was in about 1980, when her dad told her he was ready to get rid of the herd because he couldn’t take care of it anymore. “Let me do it, Daddy,” was her response.

That bit of praise motivated her.

“I had to prove to my dad that I could do it, no matter what it took,” she says.

She had such winning ways, sometimes she was the subject of practical jokes. At the Du Quoin State Fair in southern Illinois one year she won every class. When she got back from lunch, her bouquet of prize blue ribbons had been replaced by pranksters with yellow and white ones.

In the early days, she was the sole representative of her gender in the ring.

“I was the only woman out there. As time goes by, there are lots of women raising and showing cattle now,” she says.

Winning Reputation

Wearing a bright red jacket bearing the family farm name, Harris’ blonde ringlets bounce like her namesake, Shirley Temple.

She has met celebrities in her day, including Gene Autry, the Singing Cowboy. He rode up on Champion the Wonder Horse at a 1955 show and was so impressed with her he offered to sign the Premier Exhibitor banners she won that day. The two signed banners hang in a place of honor in the awards shed.

Harris knew she had to prove herself in a field dominated by men. When she came home with a World Dairy Expo championship trophy the first year after taking over, her dad almost looked a little disappointed. “I knew you could do it. I didn’t think it would be that quick,” she recalled him saying.

Clearly, Harris’ winning ways must have been intimidating to some of her competitors. As soon as they saw the names of certain Weidner bulls on the program, they knew their chances of winning were slim.

“Monster — he would just win and win,” says Cheever.

“We loved Monster so much. He was undefeated at the World Dairy Expo,” says Harris of the two-ton bull with a “sweet disposition.” “For the 16 years we showed him, he won every time.”

Even after all these years of working with livestock, she says she still cries when they lose a cow.

“We don’t look at them as just cows,” says Cheever. “They are smart and they are funny.”


As Harris and Cheever leave the awards room behind and tour the farm, one cow heads straight to Cheever as soon as he opens the gate.

“She always tries to be first,” says Harris, with a smile.

Judging from all the awards, Harris likes to be first too.

INVESTING IN *Ayrshire* COW FAMILIES

One of the Ayrshires that turned Tom and Kelli Cull into Ayrshire fans was Marilie Gentleman Karmina EX-94 who they recently lost at 11 years old. She was named Grand Champion at the 2021 International Ayrshire Show in Madison, Wisconsin.

Investing in solid cow families is something Peter Vail strongly pursued in the 1990s, but investing in Ayrshire genetics is a relatively new venture he began about 18 months ago.

“Ayrshire embryos are plentiful and because of that, I ended up investing in some great cow families,” Vail said. “The high end of the Ayrshire business is quite strong; the Karmina and Carvella cows are really well spoken-for and the sales from those cows are very strong right now.”

Bricker Farms Gibbs Carvella is a Palmyra Reality Gibbs out of a Burdette daughter and was the 2022 All-American Lifetime Component Merit Cow, Reserve All-American Aged Cow and just recently maxed out at EX-95 with a 96-point mammary system. She is owned by Todd and Lynsey Bricker of Salem, Ohio, and in 2022 she was the First-Place Aged Cow and Grand Champion at the Ohio State Fair and the New York Spring Show.

At the 2022 International Ayrshire Junior Show in Madison, she ended up first in her class, Senior Champion and Grand Champion. Most recently she was Grand Champion of the Ohio State Fair Ayrshire Junior Show and Reserve Senior Champion of the Open Show.

Carvella was the first cow that took Vail into the world of in-vitro fertilization (IVF) genetic marketing for the colored breeds. While he had IVF-bred Holsteins, he had yet to do so with an Ayrshire or Milking Shorthorn. “I bought an IVF session out of Carvella at the National Ayrshire Convention Sale, and we have flushed her to Autograph and Distinction. She produced 55 oocytes,” Vail said. “She has done very well for the Brickers.”

When he is deciding on sires, he spends time researching the cow families and asks breeders and promoters of the breed which they would use: “I check with Kurt Wolf and Mike Maier to see what they recommend, and then I make those decisions.” There is much involved in making sure a cow family not only gets the right care but is promoted correctly. Vail knows the difference and that has contributed to his success.

“We have several calves that went to Budjon in Wisconsin to be developed - a Reynolds out of Bear-Ayr Burdette Ray EX-94 2E and a Reynolds and a Distinction out of Karmina,” he noted.

Just recently Marilie Gentleman Karmina EX-94 passed away at 11 years old. “She was the cow that made Tom and Kelli (Cull) fall in love with Ayrshires,” he said. A Gentleman daughter out of Marilie Poker Karma, Vail purchased Karmina in 2016 and approached the Culls about housing her and another Ayrshire, Bear-Ayr Burdette Ray.

Kelli Cull said, “When Peter and (the late) Mike Hellenbrand first informed Tom and I regarding housing a couple of Ayrshire cows they had recently purchased, I am not going to lie; we were hesitant and slightly skeptical at first. At that point, Budjon had never seen an Ayrshire before, let alone two of them in one swoop!

“But if there is one thing we have learned about Peter (and Mike too), is that Peter knows good cows and has a tremendous eye for finding ones that need that extra care to take them to the next level. So along came Karmina from a recent show out East, and not long after that we found out that they had made another purchase, a cow by the name of Bear-Ayr Burdette Ray. From that point forward, we were smitten with these two cows. Not only were they really good show cows, but their personalities were also like no other cows we had housed before.”

Karmina was the Unanimous All-American Aged Cow in 2021, winning Senior and Grand Champion at the International Ayrshire Show and Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champion at the Midwest Regional Show. Cull said of Karmina and Ray, “Both cows had numerous Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion honors both north and south of the border, including Louisville. Oh, what fun we had with Karmina! That cow loved to show.”

The Culls discovered the Ayrshire personality that comes with the beautiful red cows. “Ray definitely had the sweetest personality of the two, that all of Team Budjon fell in love with. She was an easy keeper, easy to milk, low maintenance, eat everything kind of cow. Karmina, on the other hand ... yeah, she ate everything you put in front of her, but was pure Ayrshire sass. She was not ever mean or hard to milk, just a little more colorful demeanor than Ray.”

Cull added, “Karmina liked to toss her feed over her back, dig every pen she ever stepped in right to the ground or cement, always played ‘Twister’ with her feet when you milked her, but never kicked. But, come show day for these cows, especially Karmina ... they knew what they needed to do: eat and make milk. And that they did!

I always showed Ray, because she was a kitten to lead in the ring. Karmina, on the other hand - she would give Tom a run for his money every once in a while, but Tom, knowing this, had patience and understanding, and always let her do her thing. And when the time was right, she showed herself enough for the ‘W’ and more.”

Having calves from Karmina is vital to the Vail and Budjon team. “Karmina is for sure leaving a genetic footprint with the confirmation of her daughters. We have used bulls like Reynolds, Autograph and Distinction and all of them have become tremendous show heifers for their new owners. They all have that same beautiful, balanced cut, long-bodied, flat rump and pretty head that Karmina portrayed,” she noted.

Toppglen Wishful Thinking-ET EX-94 4E offspring have also done well for Vail. “We had three live calves from Wishful Thinking; one we sold in the Shades of Excellence Sale, one in the First Impressions at the Interstate Sale, and we have one left to flush,” he said. She is owned and developed by the Topp Family of Bremen, Ohio. Vail said they haven’t used much Kingsire, but they own several of them and they are good.

He has four Regans coming this fall from Mowry’s Burdette Mojo EX-93 2E, nominated Junior All-American Three-Year-Old in 2018, and he has one Regan daughter from Old-N-Lazy Dream of a Diva - a Dreamer daughter from Grand-View HP Burdette Dells-ET.

“We need more growth for the Ayrshire breed. Tom Cull is a perfect example of someone who didn’t want Ayrshires, but when we put one in their barn at Budjon, now he loves them!” Vail explained. “I would like to buy more, but they get pretty expensive. You never heard about these kind of Ayrshires before, but they have much better udders, feet and legs, more dairyness and they are more aggressive. We don’t have to worry about their hardiness; they have a great will to live.”

Vail runs all his embryos through Transova in Maryland, where they are sorted and sent to the different farms to be put in recipients. He has several pregnancies at Synergy in Western New York, 24 due in September and another 24 due in December. Those calves will go to Maple Downs Farm II in Middleburgh, New York, where Jason Lloyd and Lexi Payne will provide housing and care. “Jason and Lexi will have their hands full with the calves from Synergy,” he predicted. ■



Ayrshire Master Breeder

Years ago, our Master Breeder Award recipient was quoted in a prominent agriculture newspaper saying, "Ayrshires have always been a part of our lives. This is more about a passion for the breed and the desire to breed a better cow."

This statement is a testimony and a glimpse into the legacy of Ski-Pal Ayrshires and the Koss Family of Epworth, IA. David Koss and his late father Gerald played a major role in Ayrshire history in the state of Iowa and nationally. David, who is a third generation Ayrshire breeder, maintains his appreciation of the Ayrshire breed to this day.

Gerald and Maryann Koss started milking Ayrshires in 1958 south of Mt Vernon, Iowa. They raised four children: Sheryl, Venice, Sue, and Dave. All of their children shared in the responsibilities on the dairy, and they also enjoyed showing Ayrshire cattle. The family moved to their current farm in Epworth in 1974.

After graduating high school in 1979, David started working full time on the dairy with his parents. He married Karen in 1987, who came into the family with a degree in management. Love for each other, supporting the dairy industry and using your marketing talents should result in owning a thriving pizza restaurant, right? Little did Karen know the Pizza Factory would become a fond gathering place for dairy friends across the country.

During the late 80's and 90's, Ski-Pal exhibited the Grand Champion at the Iowa State Fair for 11 years in a row. Around this time, they also started participating at the National level. Their herd produced over 40 All-American nominations which included 12 All-American and Reserve All-American animals. The family also exhibited dozens of other All-American nominated animals.

David credits several influences within the Ayrshire breed and dear friends who helped to instill passion for the Ayrshire breed in their family. Most notable were Harry Lorenz from An-Mar Farm, and Bud and Ruth McHone from Iowayside Farm.

Some special home-bred animals have made lasting impressions on the breed. Ski-Pal Lot Kally was EX-93 and produced over 24,000 pounds of milk. She was the Intermediate Champion at World Dairy Expo in 2006, winner of the Kingsmill Futurity and named Unanimous All-American Sr. 3-Year-Old.

Ski-Pal exhibited the Grand Champion Ayrshire at the 1995 World Dairy Expo and Reserve Grand Champion at the 1994 World Dairy Expo. Along with these outstanding wins, an additional three intermediate and four senior, grand or reserve grand champions were shown from Ski-Pal Ayrshires at the World Dairy Expo.

Witnessing Ski-Pal genetics do well for others has been gratifying. The EX-90 Ski-Pal L G Kalina was sold to Glamour View Dairy, and she made her mark nationally for them. She was grand champion at the Mid-Atlantic National Show as a 2-year-old, and was later reserve grand champion at this show two additional times. She was reserve intermediate champion and reserve grand champion at World Dairy Expo and has earned numerous All-American honors.

There are certain pleasures that all breeders get from seeing their hard work recognized by others. Ski-Pal was honored with the Premier Exhibitor award at the 1995 World Dairy Expo. Their animals graced the cover of the October 1994 Hoard's Dairyman and represented the Ayrshire breed in the 1995 Hoard's Dairyman Judging Contest.


The Kosses never hesitated to form partnerships with different breeder friends over the years, and often those relationships yielded great results. One example was the bull Ski-Pal Good-Vue Tri Magic who was distributed by Select Sires. Hundreds of registered Ayrshires were sired by him.

We would be remiss if we didn't also acknowledge that service to the Ayrshire cow and Ayrshire people have gone hand-in-hand with master breeding for this family. Gerald was presented with the Ayrshire Distinguished Service Award in 2009. Father and son both gave endless years of commitment to work as committee and board members on the state and national levels. Dave is also a former ABA president. He has managed countless state and national Ayrshire sales, and was instrumental in developing Ayrshire sales at World Dairy Expo.

Gerald and David both took great care introducing people to the Ayrshire breed and making sure they had support as they got started. If you know Dave, and you have an understanding of the Epworth, Iowa agriculture community, you'll be able to picture this. Kurt Wolf, also an Epworth native, recently shared that Dave Koss is the only guy he knows who will deliver a pizza, truck a cow and give Ayrshire breeding advice all in one stop! Kurt credits Dave for instilling his own knowledge and love for the Ayrshire breed and has appreciated his support as he developed the Old-Bankston Ayrshire breeding program.

It's a pleasure to have Dave Koss and his wife Karen in attendance with us. They keep a busy schedule with their businesses and three daughters: Kaylee, Robin and Allison. Kaylee, the youngest, is in her final semester at the University of Iowa College of Nursing. Middle daughter Robin is a NICU travel nurse. Their oldest daughter Allison is a charge nurse at the University of Iowa Children's hospital in Iowa City. She and her husband Craig Kerper have a 2-year-old son named Jett.

Requirements for the 2022 Constructive Breeder Award

1. Only those cows bred by their owner shall be considered in qualifying. At least 50% of the herd must be bred by owner, with a minimum of ten animals. (Junior members must have a minimum of five animals.)
2. The herd must be enrolled in its second year of REWARDS, and must have completed the test year's average, on owner-bred animals, of not less than 110% of the current three-year breed average on an Energy Corrected Milk (ECM) basis. The three-year breed average (2020-2022) is 19,630 ECM; 110% of this figure is 21,593 ECM.
3. Seventy percent of the owner-bred females in milk must have been inspected under the Ayrshire Breeders' Association classification program. The owner-bred cows included in summary for the Constructive Breeder Awards must have an average score of not less than the actual average of all cows scored from the previous calendar year. For 2022, this average is 86.
4. All Constructive Breeder Awards will be calculated on data available in the office of the Ayrshire Breeders' Association at the end of the herd test year.
5. A certificate will be presented to each breeder qualifying for the Constructive Breeder Award.
6. A plaque is presented to the highest and second highest Constructive Breeder Award, based on ECM.


